Sub: Empowerment to GMs/DRMs on Security matters - Core/Non-Core areas

Directive 36 issued vide Rly Bd Letter No 2010/Sec (Spl)/6/9 dated 21.04.2017 on guidelines for Core/Non-Core areas of Railway Security has been reviewed in view of references received from Railways for additional empowerment for engaging home guards/private security and following has been approved by the Board (FC & CRB)

2. **GMs are empowered** to engage government security agencies like Home Guards, Maharashtra Industrial Security Force etc. (and not private agencies) in Core Areas of railway security to the extent of vacancy in RPF and till such time these vacancies are filled up, for a period of up to 90 days at a time or as and when the need arises e.g during summer rush, festive season etc., in consultation with PCSCs and with concurrence of PFA.
3. **DRMs are empowered** to engage Home Guards at station premises and circulating area to meet the demand of extra security personal to handle passenger rush in consultation with Sr DSC/DSC and with concurrence of Sr. DFM for a period up to 90 days. Beyond this period, DRMs would need to seek approval of GM.
4. GMs may engage government security agencies or private security agency against existing vacancies of RPF for Non-Core areas.
5. This issues with the concurrence of Associate Finance of Transformation Cell.


