- ❖ As approved by SDGM, the Central Planning cell of South Central Railway has taken up Work-study on the "Review of Staff Strength of Medical Safaiwalas at RYPS colony.
- ❖ The Work study Team approached Sr.DMO/RYPS in order to conduct Work-study on Medical Safaiwalas working under Health Inspector of Railway colony/RYPS. In this connection, Sr.DMO/RYPS nominated CHI/RYPS to coordinate and associate the Work Study Team in assessing the requirement of Medical Safaiwalas of Railway colony.
- Medical Safaiwalas of RYPS have been entrusted with the job of maintaining sanitation, which includes not only cleanliness, but also process of elimination of pathogenic bacteria and germs from human habitation i.e., Railway premises. In this process sweeping and cleaning are the related activities involved in sanitation. Sweeping is an act of the process of cleaning the waste material of rubbish, litter, garbage etc., from the Railway premises.
- While assessing the requirement of Medical Safaiwala the following elements of the job performed by them, have been taken note of.
 - i) Collection, removal and disposal off rubbish and night soil from Railway premises and colonies etc.,
 - ii) Sweeping the road and surface area of the Railway Premises and colonies and collection of the sweeping and putting these in the dustbins and removal of cobwebs etc.,
 - iii) The area of bushes to be attended which is by the side of Roads & between the quarters.
 - iv) Cleaning the drains and carrying out periodic de-silting.
 - v) Undertaking all the other activities related to cleaning of colony.
- The available yardstick which is the basis to assess the requirement of Medical Safaiwalas, as per FA & CAO's Lr.No. A/FE/Medical/57/SC, dated 17.12.68.
 - a) For colony sweeping with @ 1 lakh to 1.2 lakhs sft in 08 hours by one safaiwala.
 - b) Open Drains: For Large drains with 6000 Rft & Small drains with 8000 Rft cleaning can be done in 08 hours by one safaiwala.
 - c) The Work-study Team has taken only the net sweep-able area attended for cleaning/sweeping activity only on the basis of practical observation of the work content while calculating the requirement.

❖ After considering above factors the actual sweepable area is arrived and the manpower requirement has been assessed accordingly.

1.0 NBçÃðããðĐãð INTRODUCTION:

- 1.1 Ü÷âðð÷ü "îó ØðõòÙð"îð / RAILWAY'S ROLE: Indian Railways is one of the biggest transport organizations whose services are utilized by a large number of floating populations. It becomes more important to maintain hygiene to avoid spread of any communicable disease. Therefore, it is advised to have a set up which can ensure cleanliness and hygiene in the Railway premises both in the station area and in the Railway colony. Apart from running of trains, maintaining cleanliness in the station premises and Railway colonies is one of the prime objectives of the Railway.
- 1.2 ÇὄϋμὄδάδθοἄÚδÚδ Ùð÷ ãŏöòÎ INCREASING OPERATING EXPENSES: The operating/working expenses are increasing year after year. It is therefore imperative that to keep the working expenses within financially viable limits, the Railways have no alternative but to reduce the expenses from all the corners. The major portion of expenses being staff expenses all out efforts have to be made to contain it. In order to exercise control over expenditure, Railway Board identified certain non-core activities which are not directly related with train operations and safety can be out sourced as per RB Lr. No. E(MPP) 2016/1/59 dated 10/01/17.

 Keeping the above objects in mind and giving priority to the Railway main

- 1.4 ÇÕÕiÕÝ "iÕÚÕÁ ¡ÕØÜ ÒܵÕÕ"iÃÇÕÕ ÒÃÕØÕÕ±Õ "iÕ ÙÕÈÃÃÕ/ WORK & IMPORTANCE OF SANITATION AND MEDICAL DEPT: Sanitation means maintaining a clean environment so that the beneficiaries stay in neat and hygienic environment. The modern scientific term is Environmental Engineering. Railway stations, colonies and all work places are to be maintained in a hygienic and clean manner and adequate care is to be taken at the planning stage. Keeping this objective in view, special emphasis is laid on sweeping, collection and disposal of refuse, sewage and sullage in a scientific manner.
- 1.5 The Medical Department maintains cleanliness at railway stations and colonies where Health Inspectors are posted. The Commercial Department maintains other colonies, stations, and also the Goods Offices, Parcel offices etc., The Mechanical Department looks after the sanitation and cleanliness of the coaches. The Civil Engineering Department does so for the yards, track and underground sewerage areas. A Janitor who has staff working under his control looks after the sanitation in big offices.
- Safaiwalas situated in Railway Colony of Medical Branch are responsible for up keeping staff area around the staff quarters, service buildings. The Workstudy team studied this activity of Medical Safaiwalas of Railway colony at RYPS and presented this report.

2.0 <u>ãðÃðáÙððĐð çðü±ð¿ĐððÃÙð"î Áðûµðð/ EXISTING</u> SCENARIO:

2. 1 BRIEF HISTORY

- ➤ The Wagon Workshop, Guntupalli was sanctioned by the Ministry of Railways in the year 1973 at an estimated cost of Rs 26 Crores with an infrastructure to repair 10000 FW units per year. **The foundation stone** was laid by **Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, Prime Minister of India on 07.04.1974**. This workshop was **formally inaugurated on 16-07-1976** by Shri K.S.Rajan, General Manager, South Central Railway.
- > It is one of the **Premier Workshops** on Indian Railways planned to cater for repairs to different classes of **Broad Gauge Wagons**.
- ➤ It is situated within a periphery of 12 km from the historical city of VIJAYAWADA, on the banks of holy river KRISHNA. Also, it is encircled by prominent historical places like Kondapalli Fort, Vundavalli Caves and Akkanna Madanna Caves, Indra keeladri (Godess Durga temple), etc.
- ➤ This work shop has turned out 515 VUs during June, 2018 against Railway Board's monthly target of 510 VUs in terms of working days.

2.2 **ROLE PLAY OF DEPARTMENTS**:

A) MEDICAL:

- 1) Medical Dept. is vested with the responsibility for cleanliness of A-1, A & B Class station.
- 2) Health Inspectors are posted to maintain the station in good fettle condition. Besides the primary responsibility of Health Inspector, Station Masters will have the overall supervision with regard to cleanliness.
- 3) Areas up to 500m from the end of platforms on either side.
- 4) Awarding contracts for rag picking and garbage cleaning from the pick up point to final disposable point.

B) **OPERATING:**

- 1) Station Managers/Station Masters are responsible for the maintenance of cleanliness of D & E class stations. Besides, they are also responsible to maintain the minimum level of cleanliness at 'F' class stations.
- 2) Suitable creation of cash imprest for the above purpose and its regular upkeep, traffic Inspectors are made responsible for the regular recoupment of cash imprest of stations in their jurisdiction.

C) **COMMERCIAL**:

- 1) Commercial department is responsible for overall supervision of cleanliness at all stations.
- 2) Supply of plastic buckets, mugs, Doormats (cotton/duroturf), dustbins, polythene covers to Retiring Rooms, waiting halls and on platforms.
- 3) Awarding contracts for Pay & Use Toilets and monitoring the functioning of the contract.
- 4) Necessary guidelines and proper alerts to Traveling Public are communicated through PA system and by placing educative boards at prominent places.
- 5) Section Commercial Inspectors are responsible for maintenance of cleanliness and proper use of Station Imprest cash.

D) **ENGINEERING**:

- 1) Directly responsible for water supply for washing of Platform surface and washable tracks (CC Aprons) including provision of Nozzles Taps.
- 2) Maintenance of cleanliness of inter station areas and railway premises, i.e., areas from 500 mtrs of one station to the similar point of the adjoining station.
- 3) Cleanliness of all stations structures over and above '8' height.
- 4) Awarding contracts for rag picking, debris cleaning and defecation in the inter- station areas.

E) **MECHANICAL**:

- 1) Disinfection of all coaches and rodent control of AC coaches at the Coaching Depots.
- 2) Cleaning of trains in depots for originating trains and at stations for enroute trains as per codal provision.
- 3) Enroute cleaning of long distance traveling trains by adopting "Clean Train station" scheme.

F) **ELECTRICAL DEPT**:

- 1) Responsible for provision/maintenance/repairs of electrical switches in appropriate places for Mechanized cleaning.
- 2) Cleaning of Electrical appliances like Fans, Lights, Coolers etc,
- 3) Cleaning of water tanks of water coolers.

G) **GRP:**

1) To clear the un-authorized dead bodies on the platforms as early as possible.

2.3 BROAD CATEGORIZATION OF CLEANING ACTIVITIES AT COLONIES:

- a. Maintenance of cleanliness at all Rly. Colonies manually.
- b. Removal of debris from railway premises.
- c. Garbage disposal management.
- d. Cleaning of drains.
- e. Cleaning sanitary amenities at service buildings.

2.4 Safaiwalas of Medical Department:

2.6 DUTIES OF CHIEF HEALTH INSPECTOR /HEALTH INSPECTOR:

Chief Health Inspector and Health Inspector perform the following duties:

- a) Health Education of the community.
- b) Actively participate in all Health programmes.
- c) Report at once to the Medical Officer in charge of the division about the out break of epidemic diseases like Cholera, Plague or any suspicious increase in the mortality or sickness in his jurisdiction and take steps for control of communicable diseases in the community
- d) Carry out preventive measures including immunization
- e) Carry out census of the colony and maintain Birth and Death register.
- f) Inspect food and drinks sold to the public at the stations and colonies and work as a food inspector under the prevention of Food Adulteration Act when authorized.
- g) Look after the sanitary arrangements for fair and festivals in his jurisdiction.
- h) Monitor the quality of the water supplied by testing for residual chlorine and collecting samples for bacteriological analysis.
- i) Carry out anti mosquito, anti fly and other pest control measures.
- j) Carry out all administrative duties of his office and staff under him.
- k) Be responsible for efficient maintenance of sanitation in colonies /stations.
- See that the conservancy staff posted under him to do their work properly. He should particularly bear in mind that it is his duty not merely to order work to be done, but also see that it is actually carried out.
- m) Meet Jamedar daily and receive their reports of complaints regarding sanitation if any, investigate them, have them attended and report to his officer.
- n) Note down any defects in the drains and latrines, urinals etc., and arrange to get them repaired by Engineering Department.
- o) Visit each trenching ground at least three times a week and must see that all night soil is properly buried there.
- p) Carefully see that the terms and conditions of the various clauses of agreements with the contractors are carried out properly and any discrepancies etc., are immediately brought out to the notice of the higher authorities.

2.7 DUTIES OF SAFAIWALAS:

2.7.1 **Sanitary Jamadar (Sanitary Maistry):** He will be responsible to extract the work from Safaiwalas as per the instructions of Health Inspector.

- 2.7.2 <u>Medical Safaiwalas of Railway colonies</u>: They perform the following duties and participate in cleaning activities as per the instructions of CHI/HI for work earmarked.
 - a) Cleaning the sweeping area around Railway guarters in Railway colonies.
 - b) Cleaning of drains.
 - c) Cleaning of sanitary amenities.
 - d) Garbage disposal management.

CHAPTER - 3

Keeping this objective in view, special emphasis is laid on the collection and disposal of refuse, sewage and sullage in a scientific manner. Sanitation services are to be provided in all the Railway premises including the railway colonies, railway stations, circulating area, railway yards, office, coaches and the track. Cleanliness of these areas is a multi-disciplinary approach by various departments.
