- As approved by SDGM, the Central Planning cell of South Central Railway has taken up Work-study on the "Review of Staff Strength of Railway Junior College/GTL over GTL Division".
- Sr.DPO/GTL nominated Principal of RJC/GTL & Ch.OS of Personnel Branch to co-ordinate with the Work-study team in conducting Work-study.
- The expert committee headed by Sri. Rakesh Mohan recommended that the Indian Railways should only concentrate on the core business of transportation and has to reduce considerably the burden of managing all peripheral activities like Schools and Colleges, Colony maintenance, Medical facilities etc.
- The likely hood of college strength improving in near future is remote, as the VII CPC recommendations provide Railway employees a reimbursement of Rs. 2250/- per child per month i.e Rs 27,000/- per academic year and 6750/- per child per month i.e Rs.81,000/- per academic year in case the child is admitted to Boarding school/Junior College, encouraging the employees to admit their wards in Private schools/Junior Colleges.
- Additionally, the availability of alternate corporate/private Junior Colleges close to the Railway Junior College has further contributed to the poor patronage of Railway Junior college.
- There has been a significant change in the mindset of parents with regard to the education of their wards. Railway staff are attracted to the Private Educational Institutions with Techno concept/Model Colleges etc., Such trend adversely affected the patronage of Railway Colleges.
- A practical assessment of staff strength of Railway Junior College, GTL was made after visiting the College and observing system of working duly taking the following factors in to consideration.

#### Critical review of Railway Junior College at GTL in view of declining strength of Railway children.

Due to declining strength of students in Railway Junior College/GTL, Jr. MPC & Jr. CEC classes have been closed at the beginning of academic year 2017-18 and two classes (Sr. MPC – 1 Class & Sr. CEC – 1 Class) are only running during 2017-18. On critical review, interaction with staff, the poor patronage of Railway Junior college by Railway employees is caused due to Fee Reimbursement to the Railway children, which encouraged the Railway employees to join their wards in Private/Corporate colleges.

The declining strength of Railway Children in Railway colleges for last four years is summarized as follows.
