The work study of Railway Schools/Bilaspur (RMHSS No.1/BSP, RMHSS No.2/BSP, RMPS/Budhwari Bazar/BSP & RMPS/Loco Colony/BSP) of Education Department in Bilaspur Division has been conducted to review the existing cadre strength vis-a-vis workload in view of student strength (declining strength of Railway wards in Railway Schools), norms/yardstick, need based requirement of Teaching and Non-Teaching staff, outsourcing/eliminating of non-core activities and cost benefit analysis. Draft work study report vide this office letter dated 23.03.2021 was sent to DRM/BSP & PCPO for offering remarks. Further, a reminder addressed to Sr. DPO/BSP vide this office letter dated 17.05.2021 & 22.06.2021 was also sent to furnish the remarks. But no remarks have been received so far. Hence, the draft study report is finalised.

The work study report contains recommendation for surrender of 24 surplus vacant posts (HM-04, TGT-03, PST-07, PET-01, Demonstator-03, Game Attendant-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01 & Safaiwala-03) out of total sanctioned of 174 posts in First Phase. And after closure of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP, 12 posts (HM-01, PST-07, Peon-01, Safaiwala-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) should be surrendered in Phase-II from Education Department of Bilaspur Division.

Therefore in view of above, it is requested that suitable instructions may be given to concerned officers for implementation of the work Study report and copy of surrender memorandum may be sent to this office so that progress of implementation of work study can be advised to Railway Board accordingly.

The admission in class V may be closed from 2021-22 and so also no fresh admission in any class from academic session 2021-22. In this regard, the provision laid down in MC-18 and other extant rules may be followed. Thus, 03 vacant posts of PST out of total sanctioned of 15 posts are found surplus and should be surrendered in First Phase. And remaining 12 posts (HM-01, PST-07, Peon-01, Safaiwala-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) should be surrendered in Second Phase after closure of school. After closure of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP, live men (Teaching & Non-Teaching staff) may be redeployed in Railway Higher Secondary School/BSP against vacancies as per need and extant rules.	3.4.3
4.	Railway Mixed Primary School, Budhwari Bazar/BSP: As per details given in Para 3.1.4, total requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff for Railway Mixed Primary School/Budhwari Bazar/BSP comes to 16 against sanctioned of 19. Hence, 03 vacant posts (HM-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered.	3.4.4
	Therefore keeping in view of existing workload, declining strength of Railway wards in Railway schools, availability of Kendriya Vidyalaya & other non-Railway schools, outsourcing activities and cost benefit analysis, total requirement of Teaching/Non-teaching staff for Railway Schools/Bilaspur comes to 150 against sanctioned of 174. Hence, 24 vacant posts (HM-04, TGT-03, PST-07, PET-01, Demonstator-03, Game Attendant-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01 & Safaiwala-03) identified as surplus should be surrendered in phase-I. And after closure of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP, 12 posts (HM-01, PST-07, Peon-01, Safaiwala-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) should be surrendered in Phase-II from Education Department of Bilaspur Division.

CHAPTER-I

1.0 RAILWAY SCHOOLS / BILASPUR / BILASPUR DIVISION :

1.1 Indian Railways have set up Railway schools at various locations across the country primarily with a view to provide better educational facilities to the wards of railway employees.

The study of Railway Schools/Bilaspur (RMHSS No.1/BSP, RMHSS No.2/BSP, RMPS/Budhwari Bazar/BSP & RMPS/Loco Colony/BSP) in Bilaspur Division has been undertaken to review the existing workload and need based requirement of Teaching and Non-Teaching staff in view of student strength (declining strength of Railway wards in Railway Schools), norms/yardstick, improve efficiency by implementing the multi skilling/MTS concept and outsourcing/eliminating of non-core activities.

1.2 The operating/working expenses are increasing year after year. It is therefore imperative that to keep the working expenses within financially viable limits, Railways have no alternative but to reduce the expenses from all the corners. The major portion of expenses being staff expenses all out efforts have to be made to curtail it.

Manpower is the most costly and precious resource over Indian Railway and rightsizing is the need of the hour.

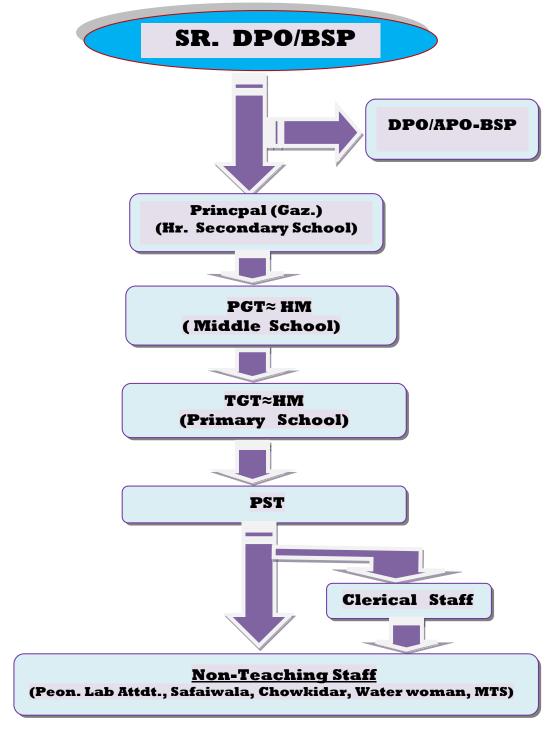
Vide Railway Board's L. No. E(MPP)2016/1/59 dated 10.01.2017 regarding "Effecting savings in manpower costs", wherein it has been stated that more non-core activities which are not directly related with train operations and safety can be outsourced.

1.3 At present 04 Railway schools are running in Bilaspur under the control of Sr. DPO/BSP. The Railway Schools are headed by Principal/Head Master. The existing status of Railway schools in Bilaspur is given below:

CHAPTER-III

3.0 CRITICAL ANALYSIS & RECOMMENDATIONS:-

The actual staff strength of Railway Schools/Bilaspur under Education Department in Bilaspur Div. is 149 (99 Departmental + 50 Contractual) against the sanctioned strength of 174 as on 01.11.2020 and thus 25 posts are lying vacant since long. Work Study Team has critically analyzed the requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff based on the existing work load, student strength (declining strength of Railway wards in Railway Schools), outsourcing/eliminating of non-core activities and applied norms/yardstick. As many Private schools have come up in the surrounding of the Railway areas within 3-4 km radius, most of the Railway staff are lured by them & due to provision of Children Education Allowance, they approach to admit their wards to these Private schools for better educational facilities. The patronage of Railway schools which were in demand is decreasing day by day.

As per provision of Children Education Allowance, Railway employees get a reimbursement of Rs. 2250/- per child per month i.e. Rs. 27000/- per academic year and Rs. 6750/- per child per month i.e. Rs. 81000/- per academic year in case the child is admitted to Boarding school which encourage the employees to admit their wards in Private schools.

3.1 Railway Board's Reference:

Some of the important Board's Guidelines are mentioned below:

- I. Vide Railway Board's letter No. E(W)2000/SC2/Master Circular/18, dated 31.05.2001 wherein it is stated that effort should be made to progressively close down the existing Railway Schools matching the expansion of Kendriya Vidyalayas & other non-Railway schools.

 In Railway areas where there is a concentration of Railway employees and the educational facilities made available by the State/Central Govt. and local/private agencies are found absent or inadequate to meet the needs of the children/wards of Railway employees, the Ministry of Railways have decided, as a matter of policy, to get established Kendriya Vidyalayas preferably in civil sector in Railway colonies which will, while meeting the needs of the employees
- **II.** Vide Railway Board's L. No. E(MPP)2016/1/59 dated 10.01.2017 regarding "Effecting savings in manpower costs", wherein it has been stated that more non-core activities which are not directly related with train operations and safety can be outsourced.

reduce our financial burden on the administration of the schools.

III. Vide Railway Board's L. No. E(MPP)2018/1/1 dated 02.07.2020 regarding "Review of Policy on creation of posts", wherein it has been stated that Surrendering 50% of existing vacancies, in other than Safety category.

There are 10 non-Railway schools including one Kendriya Vidyalaya functioning within 3-4 km. of Railway Schools/BSP (Refer Para 2.8). During the course of work study, it is revealed that there is a proposal for opening of Kendriya Vidyalayas in Railway settlements at Loco Colony/Bilaspur & Railway Colony/Shahdol in Bilaspur Division.

Railway schools, being continued as a legacy of the past, are not well patronized by the railway employees wards in present scenario and such schools can be closed down to achieve financial efficiency.

As maintaining establishment of a Railway school comes under the non-core activity, it should be reduced.

In this regard, the existing provision envisaged in **Master Circular-18** and other extant rules may be followed scrupulously.

In view of above facts, the assessment of need based requirement of staff for Railway Schools/Bilaspur has been carried out as under:

3.1 School - wise Assessment of Requirement of staff for Railway Schools in Bilaspur:

Work Study team has adopted methods for assessment of staff for Railway Schools/BSP based on the existing workload, cost benefit analysis, applying norms/yardstick & discussions held with Principals/HMs which is as under:

3.1.1 Railway Higher Secondary School NO.-1/BSP:

Comparative Position of Railway & Non-Railway students strength:

The total student strength of Railway Higher Sec. school No.-01/BSP in the year 2020-21 is 1474 out of which 1240 students belong to Railway employee's wards and 234 students belong to non-Railway. The percentage of Railway employee's wards to total student strength is about 84%.

The student strength of Railway Mixed Higher Secondary school No.-01/BSP during the year 2018 to 2020 are as under;

The above table implies that participation of Railway wards in this school is average 82%, whereas Railway has to bear the establishment cost of staff of this school which is very high.

Existing Deployment of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff:

At present one Principal (Gazetted) is working as overall in-charge of this school. Besides this 30 Regular Teacher (06 PGT, 14 TGT, 08 PST, 01 PET, 01 CT) + 25 Contractual Teachers (06 PGT, 07 TGT, 12 PST) and 14 non-teaching staff are working in this school. These contractual teachers are engaged against vacancies of teachers in Railway schools. There are 16 posts (HM-02, TGT-05, PST-07, PET-01 & Demonstrator-01) lying vacant since long time.

Assessment of Requirement of Teaching staff:

As per CBSE circular No. 03/10 dated 18.10.2010, the pupil teacher ratio should not exceed 30:1 and section teacher ratio must be 1:1.5.

As per norms of Right of Children to free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 Part-II Section-I (Section-19 and 25). Existing yard stick for deployment of teaching staff is given below:

"Number of Teachers for class I to V for student between 01-60 is 2, 61-90=03, 91-120=04, 121-200 = 05 and above 200 students, Teacher and Student ratio should be 1:40. And for class VI to VIII, (a) at least one teacher per class so that there shall be at least one Teacher for Science and Mathematics, Social Studies and Language subject, (b) Teacher and Student ratio should be 1:35, (c)One head teacher, one Physical Education Teacher and one Craft teacher for more than 100 student."

However, a positive attitude has been applied in evolving the requirement of teaching staff vis-à-vis quantum of work of individual employee by taking their work in total and followed a feasible solution to the administration as well as to the employees.

The assessment of Teaching staff is worked out as per norms of CBSE as under:

Principal: At present, 01 Principal (Gazetted) is working as overall in-charge of school which is justified.

<u>Head Master (HM):</u> At present, there is no HM deployed in this school. There are 02 sanctioned post of HM in this school which are lying vacant since long time. Work study team has assessed that there is no requirement of HM for this school as 01

Principal is already posted. Thus, 02 vacant posts of HM are found surplus.

Primary School Teacher (PST): Considering the total no. of students (i.e. 649) in Class I-V and student teacher ratio in Primary section (Class I – V), the requirement of Teacher will be 22 PST (Total no. of students \div 30 = 649/30 = 22). At present 20 PST (08 Regular + 12 Contractual) are deployed for teaching subjects & other related activities for Primary section. Hence, Work study team proposed for 02 more no. of PST for better education and monitoring of students. Therefore, total 22 PST are required and justified against the sanctioned of 26. Thus, 04 vacant posts of PST are found surplus.

Trained Graduate Teacher (TGT): Considering the total no. of students (i.e. 623) in Class VI – X and student teacher ratio in Middle & High section (Class VI – X), the requirement of Teacher will be 21 TGT (Total no. of students \div 30 = 623/30 = 21). At present 21 TGT (14 Regular + 07 Contractual) are deployed for teaching & other related activities for Middle & High section.

Requirement of Special Educator:

Special Education Teachers work with students who have a range of Learning, Mental, Emotional and Physical disabilities. They adept general education lessons and teaches various subjects, such as reading, writing and Maths. to the students with mild moderate disabilities. They also teach basic skills such as literacy and communication techniques to the students with severe disabilities.

Duties of Special Educator :- Special Education Teachers need to perform following duties:-

- I. Assess Students Skills to determine their needs
- **II.** Adapt general lessons/techniques to meet the needs of students.
- III. Develop Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) for each student.
- IV. Plan, Organize and assign activities that are specific to each student's abilities.
- **V.** Teach and mentor students as a class, in small groups and one.
- **VI.** Implement IEPs, assess student's performance and track their progress.
- **VII.** Discuss student's with parents, other Teachers, Counselors and administrators.

CBSE's guidelines regarding Special Educator:

CBSE, vide its letter no. CBSE/ACAD/JS & IC (A & T)/2015 & CBSE/AFF/Circular 13/2017 dated 25^{th} June 2015 & 13.06.2017 respectively, have made it mandatory to appoint "Special Educators" in all the affiliated schools to ensure effective and meaningful inclusion of Children with disabilities in schools.

Therefore considering the existing CBSE norms, Work Study Team propose for 01 TGT as Special Educator and 01 TGT as Counsellor for better education and monitoring of students.

Thus, total 23 TGT are required and justified against the sanctioned of 26. Thus, 03 vacant posts of TGT are found surplus.

Post Graduate Teacher (PGT): Considering the total no. of students (i.e. 202) in class XI-XII, no. of periods per day/class, no. of periods per Teacher dealt per day and subject-wise teaching faculty available in Higher secondary section (Class XI – XII), the requirement of Teacher will be 12 PGT. At present 12 PGT (06 Regular + 06 Contractual) are utilized for teaching subjects & other related activities for Higher section. Hence, present deployment of 12 PGT are required and justified.

Physical Edu. Teacher (PET): Considering the work load of Physical Education Teacher viz. to train students in various sports, organize sports events/ competitions, teach students about sports, health, physical development and nutrition., the existing deployment of 01 PET is justified against the sanctioned of 02. Thus, 01 vacant post of PET is found surplus.

<u>Craft Teacher (CT):</u> Considering the work load of Craft Teacher viz. to teach students about drawing, painting, music etc., the existing deployment of 01 CT is justified.

Demonstrator: At present, there is no Demonstrator deployed in this school. There is 01 sanctioned post of Demonstrator in this school which is lying vacant since long time (about 10 years). The existing utilization of Teachers & Lab Attendant for Lab activity viz. to demonstrate use of practical equipment, conduct experiments, exercises, workshops and to answer questions related to those demonstrations is sufficient. Work study team has assessed that there is no requirement of Demonstrator for this school. Thus, 01 vacant post of Demonstrator is found surplus.

<u>Contract Computer Teacher:</u> The existing utilization of 04 Contract Teachers for computer class should be continued since it is managed through School Development Fund collected from students.

Thus, the requirement of Teaching staff (Principal/HM/PST/TGT/PGT/PET/CT /Demonstrator) for Railway Higher Sec. School -No.1/BSP comes to 60 against sanctioned of 71. Hence, 11 vacant posts (HM-02, TGT-03, PST-04, PET-01, Demonstrator-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

Assessment of Requirement of Non-Teaching Staff:

At present 14 Non-Teaching staff (01 Librarian, 01 Sr. Clerk, Lab Attendant-03, 04 Peon, 03 W/Man, 01 Chowkidar & 01 Safaiwala) are working in this school against sanctioned of 15. In addition to this, 08 contractual staff (05 Safaiwala, 02 Chowkidar & 01 Peon) are working and it is managed through School Development Fund.

<u>Librarian:</u> There is one well equipped Library existing in this school. Considering the work load of Library management, selecting & providing books to teachers/students, the existing utilization of 01 Librarian is justified.

Sr. Clerk: At present, 01 Clerk is utilized for dealing with establishment related work, preparation of periodical reports, correspondence work etc. which is justified.

<u>Gen. Asstt./Peon:</u> Present deployment of 05 Peons (04 Regular+01 Contractual) are sufficient to carry out the required activities viz. office work such as movement of file/register, notice circulation, dispatching letters/documents, attending Principal/Teacher's call and ringing bell & other misc. work.

Lab Attendant: Considering the work load of Laboratory equipment maintenance and assist the students in Physics, Chemistry & Biology Lab, the existing utilization of 03 Lab. Attendant are required and justified against sanctioned of 03.

HKA/Safaiwala: At present, 01 Safaiwala is deployed against sanctioned of 02. It is observed that existing Safaiwala is absent since long time (about 04 years). Presently, cleaning activity of School is outsourced and 05 contractual Safaiwala are utilized for cleaning related work of school which is paid from School Development Fund and it should be continued. Considering Safaiwala activity carried out through outsourcing and monetary beneficial, 02 posts of Safaiwala are found surplus.

<u>Waterman:</u> At present, 03 Waterman are deployed against sanctioned of 02 post. The deployment of 03 water man is not justifiable in modern days as there are many water equipment like Water cooler, water tap available in school and the remaining activities being carried out by deployed waterman can be managed effectively by utilizing other staff as MTS. So out of 02 sanctioned post of Waterman, 02 waterman are justified as per existing work load and the remaining 01 Waterman as excess operated is found surplus and should be redeployed as per need elsewhere.

<u>Chowkidar:</u> At present, 03 Chowkidar (01 Regular+02 Contractual) are deployed against sanctioned of 03 post. There are three buildings of this Railway school. Considering the work load of Chowkidar, the existing utilization of 03 Chowkidar is justified.

However applying concept of Multi-skilled/Multi-tasking, these Gr. D staff should be utilized as MTS for various works in school.

Thus, the requirement of Non-Teaching staff ((Librarian, Sr. Clerk, Lab Attendant, Peon, Waterman, Chowkidar & Safaiwala)) for Railway Higher Sec. School – No.1/BSP comes to 13 against sanctioned of 15. Hence, 02 vacant posts of Safaiwala are found surplus and should be surrendered. However, existing utilisation of 08 contractual staff (05 Safaiwala, 02 Chowkidar & 01 Peon) can be continued as it is managed through School Development Fund.

Thus, total requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff for Railway Higher Sec. School -No.1/BSP comes to 73 against sanctioned of 86. Hence, 13 vacant posts (HM-02, TGT-03, PST-04, PET-01, Demonstrator-01, Safaiwala-02) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

3.1.2 Railway Higher Secondary School NO.-2/BSP:

Comparative Position of Railway & Non-Railway students strength:

The total student strength of Railway Higher Sec. school-02/BSP in the year 2020-21 is 771 out of which 250 students belong to Railway employee's wards and 521 students belong to non-Railway. The percentage of Railway wards to total student strength is about 32%.

The student strength of Railway Mixed Higher Secondary school No.-02/BSP during the year 2018 to 2020 are as under;

Existing Deployment of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff:

At present one Principal (Gazetted) is working as overall in-charge of this school. Besides this 24 Regular Teacher (09 PGT, 13 TGT, 01 PET, 01 CT) + 04 Contractual Teachers (02 PGT, 02 TGT) and 14 non-teaching staff are working in this school. These contractual teachers are engaged against vacancies of teachers in Railway schools. There are 11 posts (HM-01, TGT-06, Demonstrator-02, Safaiwala-01, Game Attendant-01) lying vacant since long time.

Assessment of Requirement of Teaching staff:

As per CBSE circular No. 03/10 dated 18.10.2010, the pupil teacher ratio should not exceed 30:1 and section teacher ratio must be 1:1.5.

As per norms of Right of Children to free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 Part-II Section-I (Section-19 and 25). Existing yard stick for deployment of teaching staff is given below:

"Number of Teachers for class I to V for student between 01-60 is 2, 61-90=03, 91-120=04, 121-200 = 05 and above 200 students, Teacher and Student ratio should be 1:40. And for class VI to VIII, (a) at least one teacher per class so that there shall be at

Requirement of Special Educator:

They adept general education lessons and teaches various subjects, such as reading, writing and Maths. to the students with mild moderate disabilities. They also teach basic skills such as literacy and communication techniques to the students with severe disabilities.

Duties of Special Educator :- Special Education Teachers need to perform following duties:-

- I. Assess Students Skills to determine their needs
- **II.** Adapt general lessons/techniques to meet the needs of students.

At present 11 PGT (09 Regular + 02 Contractual) are utilized for teaching & other related activities for Higher section. Hence, present deployment of 11 PGT is required and justified.

Physical Edu. Teacher (PET): Considering the work load of Physical Education Teacher viz. to train students in various sports, organize sports events/ competitions, teach students about sports, health, physical development and nutrition, the existing

deployment of 01 PET is justified.

<u>Craft Teacher (CT):</u> Considering the work load of Craft Teacher viz. teach students about drawing, painting, music, the existing utilization of 01 CT is justified.

Demonstrator: At present, there is no Demonstrator deployed in this school. There are 02 sanctioned post of Demonstrator in this school and lying vacant since long time (about 10 years). The existing utilization of Teachers & Lab Attendant for Lab activity viz. to demonstrate use of practical equipment, conduct experiments, exercises, workshops and to answer questions related to those demonstrations is sufficient. Work study team has assessed that there is no requirement of Demonstrator for this school. Thus, 02 vacant posts of Demonstrator are found surplus.

<u>Contract Computer Teacher:</u> The existing utilization of 02 Contract Teachers for computer class should be continued since it is managed through School Development Fund collected from students.

Thus, the requirement of Teaching staff (Principal/HM/TGT/PGT/PET/CT) for Railway Higher Sec. School -No.2/BSP comes to 35 against sanctioned of 38. Hence, 03 vacant posts (HM-01, Demonstrator-02) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

Assessment of Requirement of Non-Teaching Staff:

At present 14 Non-Teaching staff (01 Librarian, 01 OS, Lab Attendant-03, 03 Peon, 02 Waterman, 02 Chowkidar, 01 Safaiwala & 01 Mali) are working in this school against sanctioned of 16. In addition to this, 08 contractual staff (05 Safaiwala, 02 Chowkidar & 01 Peon) are working and it is managed through School Development Fund.

<u>Librarian:</u> There is one well equipped Library existing in this school. Considering the work load of Library management, selecting & providing books to teachers/students, the existing utilization of 01 Librarian is justified.

OS: At present, 01 OS is utilized for dealing with establishment related work, preparation of periodical reports, correspondence work etc. which is justified.

Gen. Asstt./Peon: Present deployment of 03 Peon are sufficient to carry out the required activities viz. office work such as movement of file/register, notice circulation, dispatching letters/documents, attending Principal/Teacher's call and ringing bell & other misc. work.

<u>Lab Attendant:</u> Considering the work load of Laboratory equipment maintenance and assist the students in Physics, Chemistry & Biology Lab, the existing utilization of 03 Lab. Attendant are justified.

<u>Game Attendant:</u> At present, there is no Game Attendant deployed in this school. There is 01 sanctioned post of Game Attendant in this school which is lying vacant since long time. Work study team has assessed that there is no requirement of Game Attendant for this school as 01 Physical Education Teacher is already posted. Thus, 01 vacant post of Game Attendant is found surplus.

HKA/Safaiwala: At present, 01 Safaiwala is deployed against sanctioned of 02 post. Presently, cleaning activity of School is outsourced and 04 contractual Safaiwala are utilized for cleaning related work of school and it is paid from School Development Fund which should be continued. Considering Safaiwala activity carried out through outsourcing and monetary beneficial, 01 vacant post of Safaiwala is found surplus.

Waterman: At present, 02 Waterman are deployed against sanctioned of 02 post. Considering existing workload of Waterman and availability of water cooler & drinking water tap, the existing utilization of 02 waterman are justified.

Chowkidar: At present, 02 Chowkidar are deployed against sanctioned of 03 post. Considering the work load of Chowkidar, the existing utilization of 02 Chowkidar is justified.

Mali: At present 01 Mali is utilised for maintenance of garden, jungle cutting and horticulture work in school. However, garden maintenance & horticulture work can be outsourced.

However, these Gr. D staff should be utilized as MTS for various works in school.

Thus, the requirement of Non-Teaching staff ((Librarian, OS, Lab Attendant, Peon, Waterman, Chowkidar, Mali & Safaiwala)) for Railway Higher Sec. School – No.2/BSP comes to 14 against sanctioned of 16. Hence, 02 vacant posts (Safaiwala-01, Game Attendant-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered. However, existing utilisation of 04 contractual Safaiwala can be continued as it is managed through School Development Fund.

Thus, total requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff for Railway Higher Sec. School -No.2/BSP comes to 49 against sanctioned of 54. Hence, 05 vacant posts (HM-01, Demonstrator-02, Safaiwala-01, Game Attendant-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

3.1.3 Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP:

3.1.3A Comparative Position of Railway & Non-Railway students:

The total student strength of Railway school/Loco Colony/BSP is 201 in the year 2020-21 out of which only 40 students belong to Railway employee's wards and 161 students belong to non-Railway. The percentage of Railway wards to total student strength is about 20%.

The student strength of Railway Mixed Primary school/Loco Colony/BSP during last 03 years from 2018 to 2020 are as under:

The above table implies that participation of Railway wards in this school is bare minimum i.e. 22%, whereas Railway has to bear the establishment cost of staff of this school which is very high. The public outside Railway are mainly being benefitted from this school.

There are 10 non-Railway schools functioning within 3-4 km. of Railway School/Loco Colony/BSP (*Refer Para 2.7*). During the course of work study, it is revealed that there is a proposal for opening of Kendriya Vidyalayas in Railway settlements at Loco Colony/Bilaspur & Railway Colony/Shahdol in Bilaspur Division.

Due to the declining strength of Railway wards in this school and availability of Kendriya Vidyalaya & other non-Railway schools, there is no justification for the continuance of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP.

3.1.3B Existing Deployment of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff:

At present one Head Master is working as overall in-charge of this school. Besides this 07 Teachers (02 PST & 05 Contractual) and 05 non-teaching staff are working in this school. There are 03 posts of PST lying vacant since long.

3.1.3C Analysis of Expenditure and Earning of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP:

- I. The existing sanctioned strength of staff in Railway School/Loco Colony/BSP is 15 and on roll staff is 13 (08 Departmental + 05 Contractual).
- II. Average Yearly Expenditure on Establishment of School staff comes to Rs. 74 Lacs approx plus maintenance cost of Railway School. (details given in Para 4.0).
- III. Average Yearly Income (Fee collected from students) of Railway School/Loco Colony/BSP in the year 2019-20 is Rs. 20 Lacs. (details given in Para-2.6)
- IV. Thus, there is huge amount of difference (73,74,192 -1990300=) 5383892 say **Fifty Four Lakhs per annum** between expenditure and earning of Railway School/Loco Colony/BSP which indicates that presently this school is being run on the huge loss.
- V. Considering the above facts in present scenario, there is need to close down the Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP in order to savings in manpower costs.

As school activity is a non-core activity in Railway, this activity should be reduced. Hence in view of above, it is recommended to close down the Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP after completion of academic session 2021-22. The admission in class I-V may be closed from academic session 2021-22 and so also no fresh admission in any class from academic session 2021-22. Moreover, parents of students who are studying in class I-V may be informed regarding closure of this school well in advance (i.e before commencement of academic session 2021-22) by the school administration so that they can admit their wards in other schools accordingly. However, the existing students of class I-V may continue their study in this school till the end of academic session 2021-22.

In this regard, the existing provision envisaged in Master Circular-18 and other extant rules may be followed scrupulously.

Hence, it is recommended that 03 surplus vacant posts of PST out of total sanctioned of 15 posts should be surrendered in First Phase. And after closure of school remaining 12 live posts should be surrendered in Second Phase.

After closure of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP, live men (Teaching & Non-Teaching staff) may be redeployed in Railway Higher Secondary School/BSP against vacancies as per need and extant rules.

3.1.3E Assessment of Requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff:

<u>Head Master (HM):</u> At present, 01 HM is working as overall in-charge of this school against sanctioned of 01 post which is found justified.

Primary School Teacher (PST): Considering the total no. of students (i.e. 201) and student teacher ratio in Primary section (Class I – V), the requirement of Teacher will be 07 PST (Total no. of students \div 30 = 201/30 = 07). At present 07 PST (02 Regular + 05 Contractual) are deployed for teaching & other related activities for Primary section. Therefore, total 07 PST are required and justified against the sanctioned of 10. Thus 03 posts of PST are found surplus.

<u>Contract Computer Teacher:</u> The existing utilization of 01 Contract Teacher for computer class should be continued since it is managed through School Development Fund collected from students.

<u>Gen. Asstt./Peon:</u> Present deployment of 01 Peon is sufficient to carry out the required activities viz. office work such as movement of file/register, notice circulation, dispatching letters/documents, attending Principal/Teacher's call and ringing bell & other misc. work.

HKA/Safaiwala: At present, 01 Safaiwala is deployed against sanctioned of 01 post. Presently, 01 contractual Safaiwala is also utilized for cleaning related work of school and it is paid from School Development Fund which should be continued.

<u>Waterman:</u> At present, 01 Waterman is deployed against sanctioned of 01 post. The deployment of Waterman is not justifiable in modern days as there are so many water equipment like Aqua guard, Water cooler, Water purifier available in market which can be easily procured through School Development Fund to meet the requirement and the related activities can be managed effectively by utilizing other staff as MTS. Hence, 01 vacant post of Waterman is found surplus.

<u>Chowkidar:</u> At present, 01 Contractual Chowkidar is deployed against sanctioned of 01 post. Considering the work load of Chowkidar, the existing utilization of 01 Chowkidar is justified.

Thus, the requirement of Teaching & Non-teaching staff for Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP comes to 12 against sanctioned of 15. Hence, 03 vacant posts of PST are found surplus and should be surrendered.

3.1.4 Railway Mixed Primary School/Budhwari Bazar/BSP:

3.1.4A Comparative Position of Railway & Non-Railway students strength:

The total student strength of Railway Mixed Primary school/Budhwari Bazar/BSP in the year 2020-21 is 578 out of which 112 students belong to Railway employee's wards and 466 students belong to non-Railway. The percentage of Railway wards to total student strength is about 20%.

The student strength of Railway Mixed Primary school/Budhwari Bazar/BSP during the year 2018 to 2020 are as under;

The above table implies that participation of Railway wards in this school is 22% only whereas Railway has to bear the establishment cost of staff of this school which is very high.

3.1.4B Existing Deployment of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff:

At present one Head Master is working as overall in-charge of this school. Besides this 12 PST (04 Regular Teacher + 08 Contractual Teachers and 03 non-teaching staff are working in this school. These contractual teachers are engaged against vacancies of teachers in Railway schools. There are 03 posts (HM-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) lying vacant since long time.

3.1.4C Assessment of Requirement of Teaching staff:

As per CBSE circular No. 03/10 dated 18.10.2010, the pupil teacher ratio should not exceed 30:1 and section teacher ratio must be 1:1.5.

As per norms of Right of Children to free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 Part-II Section-I (Section-19 and 25). Existing yard stick for deployment of teaching staff is given below:

"Number of Teachers for class I to V for student between 01-60 is 2, 61-90=03, 91-120=04, 121-200 = 05 and above 200 students, Teacher and Student ratio should be 1:40. And for class VI to VIII, (a) at least one teacher per class so that there shall be at least one Teacher for Science and Mathematics, Social Studies and Language subject, (b) Teacher and Student ratio should be 1:35, (c)One head teacher, one Physical Education Teacher and one Craft teacher for more than 100 student."

However, a positive attitude has been applied in evolving the requirement of teaching

staff vis-à-vis quantum of work of individual employee by taking their work in total and followed a feasible solution to the administration as well as to the employees. The assessment of Teaching staff is worked out as per norms of CBSE as under:

Head Master (HM): At present, 01 HM is working as overall in-charge of this school against sanctioned of 02 post. Work study team has assessed that existing 01 HM is sufficient for this school. Thus, 01 vacant posts of HM is found surplus.

Primary School Teacher (PST): Considering the total no. of students (i.e. 578) and student teacher ratio in Primary section (Class I – V), the requirement of Teacher will be 22 PST (Total no. of students ÷ 30 = 578/30 = 19). At present 12 PST (04 Regular + 08 Contractual) are deployed for teaching & other related activities for Primary section. Hence, Work study team proposed for 07 more no. of Guest Teachers for better education & monitoring of students and payment of these Guest teachers can be made through School Devolvement Fund as per existing practice. Therefore, total 12 PST are required and justified against the sanctioned of 12.

<u>Contract Computer Teacher:</u> The existing utilization of 01 Contract Teacher for computer class should be continued since it is managed through School Development Fund collected from students.

Thus, the requirement of Teaching staff (HM/PST) for Railway Mixed Primary School/Budhwari Bazar/BSP comes to 13 against sanctioned of 14. Hence, 01 vacant post of HM is found surplus and should be surrendered.

3.1.4D Assessment of Requirement of Non-Teaching Staff:

At present 03 Non-Teaching staff (01 Peon, 01 Safaiwala & 01 Mali) are working in this school against sanctioned of 05. In addition to this, 04 contractual staff (03 Safaiwala, 01 Chowkidar) are utilsed and it is managed through School Development Fund.

<u>Gen. Asstt./Peon:</u> Present deployment of 01 Peon is sufficient to carry out the required activities viz. office work such as movement of file/register, notice circulation, dispatching letters/documents, attending Principal/Teacher's call and ringing bell & other misc. work.

HKA/Safaiwala: At present, 01 Safaiwala is deployed against sanctioned of 01 post. Presently, cleaning activity of School is outsourced and 03 contractual Safaiwala are utilized for cleaning related work of school and it is paid from School Development Fund which should be continued.

<u>Waterman:</u> At present, no Waterman is deployed against sanctioned of 01 post. The deployment of Waterman is not justifiable in modern days as there are so many water equipment like Aqua guard, Water cooler, Water purifier available in market which can be easily procured through School Development Fund to meet the requirement and the related activities can be managed effectively by utilizing other staff as MTS. Hence, 01 vacant post of Waterman is found surplus.

<u>Chowkidar:</u> At present, 01 Contractual Chowkidar is deployed against sanctioned of 01 post. Considering the work load of Chowkidar, the existing utilization of 01 Chowkidar is justified.

<u>Mali:</u> At present 01 Mali is utilised for maintenance of garden in school, jungle cutting and horticulture work. Considering the work load of Mali, the existing utilization of 01 Mali is justified. However, garden maintenance & horticulture work can be outsourced.

However, these Gr. D staff should be utilized as MTS for various works in school.

Thus, the requirement of Non-Teaching staff (Peon, Waterman, Chowkidar, Mali & Safaiwala)) for Railway Mixed Primary School/Budhwari Bazar/BSP comes to 03 against sanctioned of 05. Hence, 02 vacant posts (Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered. However, existing utilisation of 04 contractual Safaiwala/Chowkidar can be continued as it is managed through

School Development Fund.

Thus, total requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff for Railway Mixed Primary School/Budhwari Bazar/BSP comes to 16 against sanctioned of 19. Hence, 03 vacant posts (HM-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

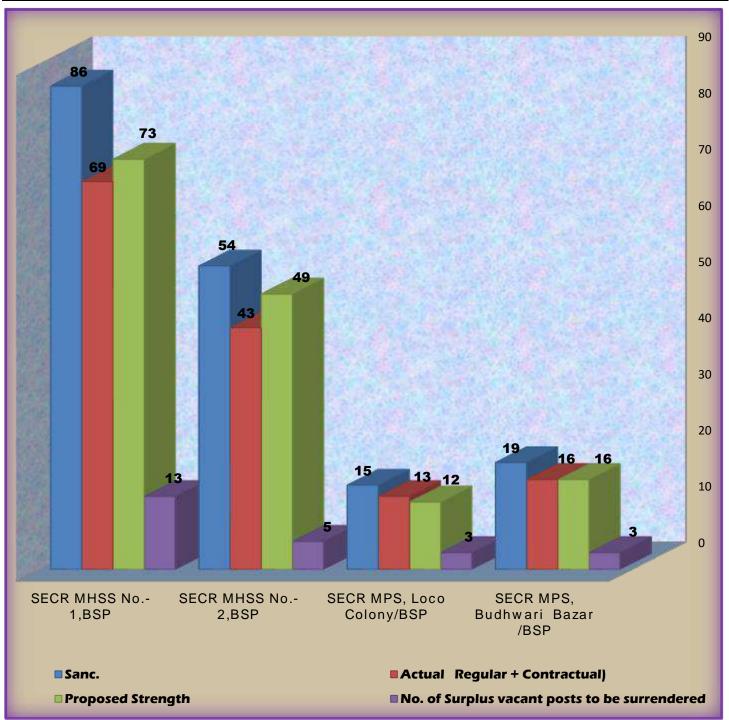

3.5 RECOMMENDATIONS & SUGGESTIONS:

On the basis of above observations and critical analysis, following recommendations & suggestions are made as under:

RECOMMENDATIONs:

1. Railway Higher Secondary School No.-01/BSP:

As per details given in Para 3.1.1, total requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff for Railway Higher Sec. School –No.1/BSP comes to 73 against sanctioned of 86. Hence, 13 vacant posts (HM-02, TGT-03, PST-04, PET-01, Demonstrator-01, Safaiwala-02) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

2. Railway Higher Secondary School No.-02/BSP:

As per details given in Para 3.1.2, total requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff for Railway Higher Sec. School –No.2/BSP comes to 49 against sanctioned of 54. Hence, 05 vacant posts (HM-01, Demonstrator-02, Safaiwala-01, Game Attendant-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

3. Railway Mixed Primary School, Loco Colony/BSP:

In view of less strength of Railway wards in Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP (i.e. 20% Railway wards of Total students), availability of 10 non-Railway schools including Kendriya Vidyalaya & 02 Railway Schools within 04 KM, considering non-core activity and in order to savings in manpower cost, it is recommended to close down the Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP after completion of academic session 2021-22. The admission in class V may be closed from 2021-22 and so also no fresh admission in any class from academic session 2021-22. In this regard, the provision laid down in MC-18 and other extant rules may be followed.

Thus, 03 vacant posts of PST out of total sanctioned of 15 posts are found surplus and should be surrendered in First Phase. And remaining 12 posts (HM-01, PST-07, Peon-01, Safaiwala-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) should be surrendered in Second Phase after closure of school.

After closure of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP, live men (Teaching & Non-Teaching staff) may be redeployed in Railway Higher Secondary School/BSP against vacancies as per need and extant rules.

4. Railway Mixed Primary School, Budhwari Bazar/BSP:

As per details given in Para 3.1.4, total requirement of Teaching & Non-Teaching staff for Railway Mixed Primary School/Budhwari Bazar/BSP comes to 16 against sanctioned of 19. Hence, 03 vacant posts (HM-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) are found surplus and should be surrendered.

Therefore keeping in view of existing workload, declining strength of Railway wards in Railway schools, availability of Kendriya Vidyalaya & other non-Railway schools, outsourcing activities and cost benefit analysis, total requirement of Teaching/Nonteaching staff for Railway Schools/Bilaspur comes to 150 against sanctioned of 174. Hence, 24 vacant posts (HM-04, TGT-03, PST-07, PET-01, Demonstator-03, Game Attendant-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01 & Safaiwala-03) identified as surplus should be surrendered in phase- I. And after closure of Railway Mixed Primary School/Loco Colony/BSP, 12 posts (HM-01, PST-07, Peon-01, Safaiwala-01, Waterman-01, Chowkidar-01) should be surrendered in Phase-II from Education Department of Bilaspur Division.

- 5. The money value of surrendered posts can be utilised for creation of safety & essential posts as per need and extant rules.
- 6. It is recommended that all the existing Gr. D categories (Peon, Water man, Lab Attendant, Safaiwala, Chowkidar, Mali) should be categorized as MTS (Multi-Tasking Staff) so that their services can be utilized efficiently for multi-task activities.

SUGGESTIONs: 1. The existing utilization of Contractual Teachers and Group "D" staff on contract basis in RHSS No.1, 2 & MPS/Budhwari/BSP should be continued since it is cost effective and managed through Personnel Deptt. or School Development Fund. 2. There should be a uniform academic calendar i.e. Syllabus, Examination date, working culture for all Railway Schools over SECR for better planning and achievement of objectives which may be planned by PCPO office. Considering present scenario, Fees structure of Railway Schools/BSP can be increased for 3. the development of infrastructure of the schools which may be planned by Division. Teachers should be trained by the NCERT from time to time to improve their professional 4. competency. There should be periodical transfer of Teaching staff in all Railway schools. 5.
