**Sub: Ceiling on two family pensions admissible to child/children of
deceased Railway servants under Rule 75 (11) of the Railway
Services (Pension) Rules, 1993.**

Consequent upon the revision of the rates and minimum and maximum limits of the family pension following the implementation of the recommendations of the Fifth Central Pay Commission, the question of revision of the maximum of ceilings on two family pensions admissible under sub-rule (11) of Rule 75 of the Railway Services (Pension) Rules, 1993 to child/children, where both of his/her/their deceased parents were Government/Railway servants and governed by the said rules or the corresponding provisions of the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972, has been under consideration of the Government in the Department of Pension & Pensioners' Welfare. After careful consideration it has been decided by the Government to revise the existing limits on two family pensions as follows:-

- (i) The existing maximum limit of Rs. 2500 (Rupees two thousand five hundred) per month laid down in sub-rule (11) (a)(i) revised upwards to Rs. 15000 (Rupees Fifteen thousand) per month.
 - (ii) The existing maximum limit of Rs. 2500 (Rupees two thousand five hundred) per month laid down in sub-rule (11) (a) (ii) revised upwards to Rs. 15000 (Rupees Fifteen Thousand) per month.
 - (iii) The existing maximum limit of Rs. 1250 (Rupees One thousand two hundred and fifty) per month laid down in sub-rule 11 (b) revised upwards to Rs. 9000 (Rupees Nine thousand) per month.
2. These orders shall be deemed to have taken effect from the 1st January, 1996. The relevant rules under the Railway Services (Pension) Rules, 1993 will be amended suitably in due course.

सेवकों के बच्चे/बच्चों को अनुज्ञेय दो, कुटुम्ब पेंशनों पर अधिकतम सीमा.

पाँचवे केन्द्रीय वेतन आयोग की सिफारिशों के कार्यान्वयन के अनुसरण में कुटुम्ब पेंशन की दरों तथा न्यूनतम एवं अधिकतम सीमा में संशोधन के परिणामस्वरूप, रेल सेवा (पेंशन) नियम 1993 के नियम 75 के उप नियम (11) के अंतर्गत ऐसे बच्चे/बच्चों, जिसके/जिनके दिवंगत माता-पिता दोनों सरकारी कर्मचारी/रेलवे सेवक थे और उपर्युक्त नियमों अथवा केन्द्रीय सिविल सेवा (पेंशन) नियम 1972 के तदनुरूपी व्यवस्थाओं द्वारा शासित होते थे, को अनुज्ञेय दो, कुटुम्ब पेंशनों की अधिकतम सीमा में परिवर्तन किए जाने का प्रश्न सरकार के पेंशन तथा पेंशनभोगी कल्याण विभाग में विचाराधीन रहा है. सरकार ने ध्यानपूर्वक विचार करने के पश्चात दो कुटुम्ब पेंशनों की मौजूदा सीमा में निम्नानुसार परिवर्तन करने का निर्णय लिया है :-

(i) उप नियम (11) (क) (i) में विहित 2500 रुपए (दो हजार पाँच सौ रुपए) प्रतिमाह की मौजूदा अधिकतम सीमा को बढ़ाकर 15000 रुपए (पन्द्रह हजार रुपए) प्रतिमाह कर दिया गया है.

(ii) उप नियम (11) (क) (ii) में विहित 2500 रुपए (दो हजार पाँच सौ रुपए) प्रतिमाह की मौजूदा अधिकतम सीमा को बढ़ाकर 15000 रुपए (पन्द्रह हजार रुपए) प्रतिमाह कर दिया गया है.

(iii) उप नियम 11 (ख) में विहित 1250 रुपए (एक हजार दो सौ पचास रुपए) प्रतिमाह की मौजूदा अधिकतम सीमा को बढ़ाकर 9000 रुपए (नौ हजार रुपए) प्रतिमाह कर दिया गया है.

2. ये आदेश एक जनवरी, 1996 से लागू हुए समझे जाएंगे. रेल सेवा (पेंशन) नियम, 1993 के अंतर्गत संगत नियमों को समुचित रूप से यथा समय संशोधित किया जाएगा.

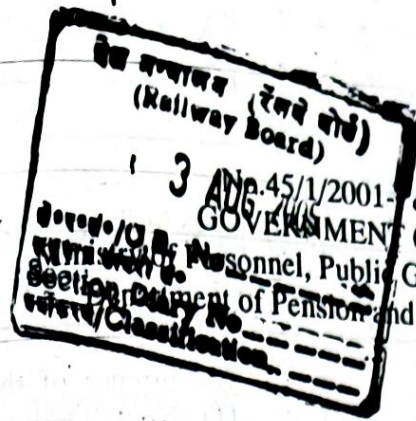

OFFICE MEMORANDUM.

Subject:- Ceiling on two family pensions admissible to child/children of deceased Government servants under Rule 54 (11) of the CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972.

The undersigned is directed to say that consequent upon the revision of the rates and minimum and maximum limits of the family pension following the implementation of the recommendations of the Fifth Central Pay Commission, the question of revision of the maximum of ceilings on two family pensions admissible under sub-rule (11) of Rule 54 of the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 to child/children, where both of his/their deceased parents were Government servants and governed by the said rules, has been under consideration in this Department.

2. After careful consideration the Government has decided to revise the existing limits on two family pensions as follows: -

- (i) The existing maximum limit of Rs.2500 (Rupees two thousand five hundred) per month laid down in sub-rule (11)(a)(i) revised upwards to Rs.15000 (Rupees Fifteen thousand) per month.
- (ii) The existing maximum limit of Rs.2500 (Rupees two thousand five hundred) per month laid down in sub-rule (11)(a)(ii) revised upwards to Rs.15000 (Rupees Fifteen thousand) per month.
- (iii) The existing maximum limit of Rs.1250 (Rupees One thousand two hundred and fifty) per month laid down in sub-rule 11(b) revised upwards to Rs.9000 (Rupees Nine thousand) per month.

3. These orders shall be deemed to have taken effect from the 1st January, 1996. The relevant rules under the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 are being amended suitably.

4. These orders do not apply to Railway employees, persons paid from Defence Services estimates and the members of the All India Services. Separate orders in their respect would be issued by the respective Ministries/Departments.

5. In their application to the families of pensioners who retired/retire from Indian Audit and Accounts Departments, these orders have been issued after consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General of India.

6. These orders issue with the concurrence of the Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure vide their U.O.No.810/EV/2003 dated 17.10.2003.
