Sub:- Implementation of Ayushman Bharat Yojna (Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojna) in Railway hospitals.-Reg.

As the zones are aware, Railway Board has decided to provide medical facilities to the eligible beneficiaries of Ayushman Bharat Yojna (Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojna) in Railway hospitals also. Such facilities are to be provided in all Railway hospitals except those where the hospitals are located in restricted areas. A list containing details of hospitals where such facility is to be provided under the scheme is enclosed herewith which has been prepared after consolidation of details of hospitals provided by zones.

For the purpose of implementation of the scheme, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been entered into between Ministry of Railways and National Health Agency under Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Govt. of India. A copy of the MoU entered into is also enclosed herewith. Action may be ensured as per provisions of MoU by the zones.

It has been decided that the facility should be provided to the beneficiaries in identified Railway hospitals with immediate effect. A detailed procedure order on the implementation of the scheme is also being sent shortly.

In the meantime, **all the zones are desired** to nominate one doctor and one non-gazetted staff as coordinator specifically for this purpose in each participating Railway hospital. Name, designation, e-mail and telephone details including mobile numbers of such doctors and the staff be sent to this office as well as National Health Agency at their address mentioned below immediately for better coordination between the hospitals and National Health Agency.

National Health Agency is going to organize a training program for the nominated doctors and the officials on the issue of implementation of scheme. The zones will ensure that the nominated doctors and officials should invariably attend the training program organized by National Health Agency so that they are fully updated on the subject.

Memorandum of Understanding

between

the National Health Agency, Government of India, hereinafter called the NHA

and

Directorate General (Railway Health Services) Ministry of Railways

Government of India

for providing services under

Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri – Jan Arogya Yojana


This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) made at NEW DELHI on this day of 24 January 2019.


The National Health Agency and the Directorate General (Railway Health Services) to join the AB PM - JAY provider network and willingness to extend cashless medical facilities for surgical/ medical management procedures as per "AB PM – JAY benefit cover for secondary and tertiary care hospitalizations only in the specialties which are available in specified hospitals to all eligible AB PM - JAY families". No OPD treatment / care will be provided.

1. STANDARD DEFINITIONS & INTERPRETATIONS

- A. AB PM - JAY shall refer to Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri – Jan Arogya Yojana.
- B. NHA shall mean the National Health Agency, the apex body for setting policy, design and rollout of AB PM - JAY in alliance with State governments.
- C. SHA shall mean State Health Agency and refers to the agency / body set up at the State / UT level for the purpose of coordinating, managing and implementing the AB PM - JAY.
- D. ALLIANCE shall mean implementing AB PM - JAY at the State level in alliance with State programs.
- E. SUM INSURED shall mean the sum of Rs. 5,00,000/- (INR Five lakhs only) per AB PM - JAY Beneficiary Family Unit per annum or any other coverage as determined by the Government of India from time to time under AB PM - JAY.
- F. BENEFICIARY FAMILY UNIT refers to those families including all its members figuring in the Socio-Economic Caste Census (SECC) database under the deprivation criteria specified or any additional categories as may be decided by Government of India from time to time under AB PM - JAY.




- G. **BENEFIT COVER** refers to the treatment package of benefits that the insured families would receive under the AB PM - JAY as may be decided by Government of India from time to time.
- H. **EHCP** shall refer to Empanelled Health Care Provider, that is, public or private hospitals that have been empanelled BY States across the country under AB PM - JAY.
- I. **NATIONAL HEALTHCARE PROVIDER (RAILWAYS) (NHCP Rly)** shall refer to identified medical establishments/ institutions of Indian Railways under the administration of the Ministry of Railways, Government of India.
- J. **PAYER** means the respective SHA responsible for the actual payment for Covered Services rendered to AB PM - JAY beneficiaries that has entered into an alliance with NHA. Payers may include State Health Agencies or intermediaries hired by them such as Insurance companies.
- K. **BENEFIT PACKAGE & RATES:** Each benefit hospitalization package is standardized that includes all benefits required during the entire episode of care in respect to the identified ailment, such as
- Medical examination, treatment, and consultation
 - Medicine and medical consumables
 - Non-intensive and intensive care services
 - Diagnostic and laboratory investigations
 - Medical implant services (where necessary)
 - Accommodation benefits for the patient
 - Food services for beneficiary in care are included in the packages
 - Administrative services



- Expenses incurred for diagnostic test and medicines before the admission of the patient leading to the package
- At discharge, diagnostic tests and medicines required for recovery from the same ailment/ surgery up to a limit of 15 days should be provided by the treating health facility all included in the package rate.
- In the case of cancer treatments, preliminary investigations incurred towards approval of the appropriate clinical treatment approach to be included in the approved treatment package.
- Investigations not available in Railway hospital shall be referred EHCP Hospitals.
- In case of non-availability of required treatment facilities/beds/implants etc., the patient will be referred to EHCP Hospitals under AB PM-JAY.

2. BACKGROUND

- a) As part of the comprehensive health care vision of the Government of India, the Aarogya Bharat – National Health Protection Mission (AB PM - JAY) provides financial coverage related to hospitalization up to five lakh rupees to 10 crore poor and vulnerable households (approx. 50 crore beneficiaries). With the choice of accessing services at both public and private providers across the country, this ambitious mission aids in protecting beneficiary households against health-related contingencies across the life cycle. To operationalize the scheme at the National level, and to rollout the scheme in coordination with the various State Governments, the NHA has been established.
- b) Ensuring access to and delivery of safe, quality health services to its beneficiaries is core to the vision of AB PM - JAY. Health care services under AB PM - JAY will be provided through a network of public hospitals and empanelled private providers. The government

is committed to developing a strategic partnership with providers so that the vision of AB PM - JAY becomes a reality. Empanelment of health care providers and institutions is a key aspect of this partnership.

- c) In the above regard, it has been decided to bring all identified medical establishments having inpatient hospitalizations under MoHFW and Ministry of Railways including institutions of national significance into the provider network of AB PM - JAY to strengthen service delivery under mission.


3. PURPOSE

The purpose of this document is to specify the specific agreements the NHA and the NHCP (Rly) will adopt in order to implement a collaboration for strengthening service delivery under AB PM - JAY.

4. PROVISIONS

4.1. Registration into the AB PM - JAY provider network: NHCP (Rly) i.e. identified individual Railway Hospital will directly register into AB PM - JAY provider network and be portable for all States irrespective of its home state of location. NHCP (Rly) i.e. identified individual Railway Hospital needs to provide information about the establishment online at the nation-wide empanelment interface to be registered into the AB PM - JAY provider network.

4.2. Cashless service provision: AB PM - JAY beneficiaries shall be provided treatment free of cost for all such ailments covered under AB PM - JAY within the limits, sub-limits and sum insured, i.e., not specifically excluded under the Scheme. **The NHCP(Rly) shall be reimbursed as per the package cost applicable specified in the 'AB PM - JAY**



benefits manual for such treatments and pre-authorized amount in case of unspecified packages.


Treatment packages include consultation, medicine, diagnostics, implants, food, hospital charges etc. In other words the package should cover the entire cost of patient from date of reporting to his discharge from hospital 15 days after discharge, making the transaction truly cashless to the patient. And under no circumstances shall charge any money extra within the treatment period of package.

4.3. Identification of beneficiaries: Beneficiaries will be identified using Aadhaar and/or Ration Card and/or any other specified identification document produced by the beneficiary at the point of contact. This would undergo pre-authorization from the Source State of the AB PM - JAY beneficiary online. The requisite process and guidelines will be as mandated by NHA.

4.4 Pre-Authorization: All procedures shall be subject to mandatory pre-authorization by the source state. Approval for pre-authorization will be coordinated online.

4.5. Human Resource Requirements: NHCP(RIy) needs to appoint a Medical Coordinator (Part time) & a Non-Medical Coordinator (Full time) to facilitate beneficiary management.

- i. The non-medical coordinator Arogya Mitra will manage the helpdesk role for the patients visiting the hospital, acting as a facilitator for beneficiaries and are the face of interaction for the beneficiaries. Their role will include helping in beneficiary identification & verification at reception, preauthorization, claim settlement, follow-up and Kiosk-management (including proper scheme IEC).



- ii. The medical coordinator will be an identified doctor in the Railway Hospital who will facilitate submission of online pre-authorization and claims requests, follow up for meeting any deficiencies and coordinating necessary and appropriate treatment in the hospital.

4.6 Structural Requirements: Space for a kiosk for AB PM - JAY beneficiary management *will be provided at identified* individual Railway hospital reception.

- i. These kiosks need to be equipped with IT Hardware requirements such as desktop/laptop with internet, printer, webcam, scanner/ fax, bio-metric device etc. as mandated by the NHA from time to time.
- ii. Ensure appropriate promotion of AB PM - JAY in and around the hospital (display banners, brochures etc.) towards effective publicity of the scheme in co-ordination with the SHA (district level AB PM - JAY team).
- iii. Expenditure for setting up the above infrastructure including IT Hardware requirements such as desktop/laptop with internet, printer, webcam, scanner/ fax, bio-metric device etc. its maintenance, replacement, its running cost back up AMC etc will be borne by the Railway.
- iv. Guidelines of AB PM - JAY kiosk management will be shared by NHA.

4.7 National Portability: The NHA has laid down the process and terms for extending portability of benefits to all AB PM - JAY beneficiaries across the EHCP network in India. This will be applicable to all NHCPs.

4.8 IT System and Technical Support: The NHA shall provide an IT platform with functional modules for identification of eligible beneficiaries, transaction and claim




management and provision of all services under AB PM - JAY. The NHA will also support in requisite training for the assigned personnel within the NHCP (Rly) for the same.

4.9 Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials: The NHA shall provide standard IEC material and branding to NHCP (Rly) for dissemination to ensure uniformity in messaging to the beneficiaries.

4.10 Training and Capacity Building: The NHA shall provide standard training manuals in organizing orientation cum sensitization workshops for AB PM - JAY. NHCP (Rly).

4.11 Grievance Redressal: Complaints and grievance redressal management system for NHCP (Rly) will be handled by the NHA. NHA would establish a specific pathway for grievance redressal for NHCP (Rly) which would have the authority to not only immediately redress the grievance but also recommend action to be undertaken within a stipulated time period. A major change will be effected with the introduction of a National Call Center. Complaints from various stakeholders including hospital authorities and beneficiaries will be logged at the call centre and the call center shall direct these complaints to the intended authorities. Each complaint/grievance shall be closely monitored by a dedicated team at MoHFW to check resolution times and intervene when unresolved. Guidelines on the same will be communicated by NHA including the channels through which complaints/ grievances can be registered, acknowledged, monitored and resolved at various levels.



4.12 Collaborating Centers: As knowledge hubs for generating evidence and informing policy inputs for AB PM - JAY, NHCP (Rly) play an important role in the generation of knowledge to improve the quality of health care in the regions they cover. Areas of engagement may be decided mutually by both parties from time to time.


4.13 Undertaking: NHCP (Rly) warrants that it will ensure all the required facilities for performing the available surgeries + procedures + therapies as specified under the 'Benefits manual of AB PM - JAY', subject to availability.

- i. Final package rates applicable for all NHCP (Rly) Hospitals will be displayed by AB PM – JAY as well as on the respective websites NHCP (Rly) Hospitals.

5 PAYMENT TERMS & CONDITIONS

5.1 Package rates: Reimbursements shall be based on national rates set by the NHA and the process of reimbursements shall be made based on the current implementation mechanisms present in AB PM - JAY States. UTs, referred to as the PAYERS.

- i. If it is a trust, the SHAs shall directly reimburse as per package rates approved by NHA.
- ii. If it is through an intermediary, insurance companies assigned to the respective SHAs shall reimburse as per package rates approved by NHA.
- iii. *The Source State of the AB PM - JAY beneficiary shall be responsible for payments for care accessed in a NHCP (Rly). This will be coordinated online. Requisite guidelines will be communicated by NHA.*





In addition, NHCPs are eligible to avail performance-linked incentives such as


- i. Qualifying for NABH entry-level accreditation will receive an additional 10% package rate
- ii. While those qualifying for full accreditation will receive an additional 15% package rate
- iii. To promote equity in access, hospitals providing services in aspirational districts will receive an additional 10% package rate
- iv. Teaching hospitals will receive additional 10% package rate

5.2 Billing & Payment cycle: NHCP (Rly) shall be obliged to submit their claims in the format prescribed by NHA online.

- i. The PAYER shall be responsible for settling all claims within 30 days after receiving all the required information documents.
- ii. Guidelines for submission of claims, claims processing, and handling of claim queries, dealing with fraudulent claims and all other related details will be communicated by the NHA. For all fraudulent cases, respective hospital giving treatment will be responsible.

5.3 NHCP Identified individual Railway Hospitals would be provided with a corpus fund of Rs. 2 lakhs each for their operational expenses to be recouped from time to time and by considering the example of Hospital Management Society (HMS) and Rogi Kalyan Samiti (RKS) It was further suggested that each hospital would have separate account for Ayushman Bharat.

5.4 Receipt, Accountal, Accrual and Audit etc will be done by identified Railway hospital along with their concerned account department.



6 RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES

6.1 Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to create between the Parties any partnership, joint venture or relationship of principal and agent or master and servant or employer and employee or any affiliate or subsidiaries thereof. Each of the Parties hereto agree not to hold itself or allow its directors, employees, agents, representatives to hold out to be a principal or an agent, employee or any subsidiary or affiliate of the other.

7 LAW AND ARBITRATION

7.1 The provisions of this MoU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with Indian Law.

7.2 Any dispute, controversy or claims arising out of or in relation to this MoU or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof, shall be settled by arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.

7.3 The arbitral tribunal shall be composed of three arbitrators, one arbitrator appointed by each Party and one another arbitrator appointed by the mutual consent of the arbitrators so appointed.

7.4 The place of arbitration shall be in Delhi and any award whether interim or final, shall be made, and shall be deemed for all purposes between the parties to be made in Delhi.

7.5 The arbitral procedure shall be conducted in the English language and any award or awards shall be rendered in English. The procedural law of the arbitration shall be Indian Law.

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


- 7.6 The award of the arbitrator shall be final and conclusive and binding upon the Parties, and the Parties shall be entitled (but not obliged) to enter judgment thereon in any one or more of the highest courts having jurisdiction.
- 7.7 The rights and obligations of the Parties under, or pursuant to, this Clause including the arbitration agreement in this Clause, shall be governed by and subject to Indian Law.
- 7.8 The cost of the arbitration proceeding would be borne by the parties on equal sharing basis.

8 MISCELLANEOUS

8.1 Term, renewal and termination: The term of this MOU is initially for a period of *one (1) year* commencing on 24 Jan 2019. It may be extended for a further period of two years. This MoU shall be reviewed periodically, but at least every *one* year or upon written request by either party and may be amended by the written consent of the authorized representatives.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, this *MOU* may be terminated by either party for any reason of the term hereof by giving 180 days prior written notice citing reasons to the other party of its intention to withdraw from this Agreement and by ensuring the continuity of care to AB PM - JAY beneficiaries patients who already are involved in the treatment process and during the transition process. The Parties shall conduct as many coordination and conciliation meetings as possible during this period to explore ways to continue the MoU, if needed.







8.2 Confidentiality: The NHCP (Pty) shall maintain the confidentiality of all patient health information and medical records in accordance with applicable guidelines set by the NHA from time to time.

8.3 Severability: The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this MoU in any jurisdiction shall not affect the validity, legality or enforceability of the remainder of this MoU in such jurisdiction or the validity, legality or enforceability of this MoU, including any such provision, in any other jurisdiction. It being intended that all rights and obligations of the Parties hereunder shall be enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
