Subject:- Introduction of the scheme to call Medical Consultants to Railway Hospitals for providing professional services on case to case basis.

Railway Ministry has decided to introduce a new scheme of calling leading Medical Professional Consultants of the locality, who are willing to come and work in Railway Hospitals, by payment of consultancy fees on case-to-case basis. The exact Methodology for engaging such consultants is given below:-

1. Each Railway Hospital In-charges (MD, CMS and MS In-charges) will maintain a list of leading medical specialists of that locality who are also willing to come and work in Railway Hospitals. For this purpose MD/CMS/MS Incharge of the Railway hospital will constitute a Committee of 3 Senior doctors from that hospital. The Committee will prepare a provisional list of Specialist doctors, which is required to be approved, by MD/CMS/MS incharge of the Railway Hospital.
2. They will be called on case-to-case basis. They are to be called for Management of such cases, who cannot be fully managed by the I.R.M.S. specialist doctors and Honorary Visiting Specialist doctors of that Railway hospital.
3. Rate of payment:-
 - 3.1 Consultancy fees - Fees will be from Rs.200/- to Rs.500/- per case. For additional cases during the same visit, Rs. 50/- to Rs.100/- per additional case. Rate of payment to be decided by the Zonal CMD and the FA&CAO within the limits as given.
 - 3.2 For Surgical procedures:- The upper limit of payment will be
 - For Minor Surgery - Rs.2000/- per case as a package rate
 - For Major Surgery - Rs.5000/- per case as a package rate
 - For Special Surgery - Rs.8000/- per case as a package rate


The Package Contains

- Pre Operation one check up
- The Surgical Operation.
- Post operative follow up for 3 days (Excluding the day of operation).

4. There will be an upper ceiling limit of expenditure for each zone as under:-

(a) For NR, SR, SCR, WR, CR, ER, SER, NER, NFR (Rs. 20 lakhs per year/zone)	- 1.80 crores/year
(b) For NWR, NCR, ECR, ECoR, SECR, WCR, SWR (Rs.10 lakhs per year/zone)	- 0.70 crores/year
Total	- <u>2.50 crores/year</u>

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5. Competent authority to sanction is MD/CMS/MS In charges of Railway Hospitals.
