विषय : रेलवे स्टेशनों की स्वच्छता/सफाई हेतु मार्ग निर्देश
Sub: - Guidelines for sanitation/cleanliness of Railway Stations.

A greater emphasis has been given to improve over the status of sanitation/cleanliness of the Railway Station. Railway Board desires that there has to be a perceptible improvement in the status of sanitation/cleanliness of the Railway Stations immediately and it should be maintained on long term basis. Railway Stations classified as A-1, A & B are to be given priority.

Executive Director Passenger Marketing (ED/PM) Railway Board in their Commercial Circular No 107 of 2006 dated, 20-12-2006 has issued guidelines for sanitation/cleanliness of Railway Stations. Various points raised in the letter are required to be followed by all the Departments of Zonal Railways so that the end result of improvement in sanitation/cleanliness of the Railway Stations is achieved.

Some of the points which are relevant for Medical Department (for most of the zones, if not for all the zones) are further clarified as below:

1. स्वास्थ्य निरीक्षकों की पर्याप्त संख्या./Adequate Number of Health Inspectors

1.1 There has to be adequate number of Health Inspectors for Railway Stations to do proper supervision of the Sanitation/Cleanliness work at Railway Stations.

1.2 Railway Board desired that in all A-1 Class Railway Station Health Inspectors should be available round the clock. In all A Class Stations one or more number of Health Inspectors should be available. In all B Class Railway Stations one Health Inspector should be provided.

1.3 Due to increased importance of sanitation at Railway Stations, it must be ensured that the Health Inspectors posted in Railway Stations should be able to do his/her job exclusively for Railway Station only. He/she should not have any additional responsibility of supervision of Colony Sanitation. If this arrangement exists, necessary corrective measures are required to be undertaken.

1.4 Additional number of posts of Health Inspectors required should be created and filled up. as per rules.

1.5 Following factors determine the work load required to be handled by the Health Inspectors to ensure proper supervision of cleanliness on the Railway Stations:-

1. Total number of passengers per day.
2. Number of platforms.
3. Number of trains originating/terminating.
4. Number of trains passing through /halting and passing through.

As it is observed that the magnitude of the above factors varies widely from station to station, it has been considered necessary to frame yard sticks that need to be followed for calculation of total number of Health Inspectors required for the Stations of A-1, A and B category. These guidelines have been prepared in consultation with the Northern Railway, Eastern Railway, Western Railway, Central Railway and Southern Railway.

(a) There should one Health Inspector who should work as Incharge and should be present for 6 days/week in normal office working hours only.

(b) For 3 shifts, the number should be determined based upon the number of Platforms.

<u>No. of Platform</u>	<u>Morning</u>	<u>Evening</u>	<u>Night</u>
6 or below	2	1	1
Additional for every 4-6 No. of additional platforms	1	1	1

(c) Adequate number of Rest Giver (RG) and Leave Reserve (LR) should be worked out separately.

2. कचरा हटाने संबंधी ठेके/Garbage Removal Contracts

The Garbage removal contract should be valid all days throughout the year without any failure. Extension, Renewal or New Contract should be done in proper time.

While finalizing the contract, the contract should be finalized in such a way that if required the contractor should make arrangement of removal of garbage many time in the day/night. The important point to note that the garbage from Station is removed so frequently that most of the time at the day/night the Garbage Collection Dump at Railway Station should remain empty.

You are requested to take up suitable action on these lines promptly.

A compliance report may please be sent every 15 days.

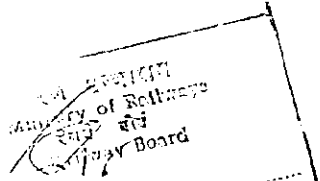


Sub: Change in Designation of Physiotherapist on Railways.
