Sub : Transfer Policy of RPF staff
posted in Production Units.


Although, a clear and transparent Transfer Policy has been laid down vide my Standing Order No. 2/1996 dated 22.05.96 yet it has come to my notice that RPF officers and staff posted in Production Units like R.C.F./Kapurthala, D.L.W./Varanasi, C.L.W./Chittaranjan, I.C.F./Madras and W.A.P./Yalahanka (Bangalore) are only being rotated within the same unit. This is because of the fact that the Sr. Security Commissioner/ Security Commissioner of the Production Units do not have the power and authority to transfer the staff outside the jurisdiction of the Production Unit. Thereby, the Standing Order issued is not being complied with in its true letter and spirit.

With a view to overcome this bottleneck it is hereby ordered that henceforth RPF officers and staff posted in the following Production Units will on completion of their tenure be liable for transfer to neighbouring divisions as indicated hereunder :

4. I.C.F./Madras, S.Rly.	Madras & Tiruchchirapalli
5. W.A.P./Yallahanka, S.Rly.	Bangalore & Mysore.

DSCs concerned are hereby directed to ensure that the transfer of RPF officers and staff posted in Production Units is organised as indicated above in the light of the above mentioned Standing Order already issued.

Even for the normal transfer of Constables for which DSCs are competent, it is suggested that there should be transparency even in the transfers done by them. A definite policy should be adopted about transfers based on the guidelines already issued. It is also suggested that CSCs may get a certificate from DSCs that all transfers have been done as per guidelines on the subject and in case of any deviation, detailed reasons be obtained from DSCs and finally approved by CSCs at their level. Complaints have been received in this regard. Whatever has to be done should be totally transparent.
