STANDING ORDER NO. 19

Sub:- Holding of Monthly Crime Review Meetings/Border Meetings by CSCs of Zonal Railways.

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The CSCs of the Zones will hold Monthly Crime Review Meetings with their respective Divisional Security Commissioner on any day between the 8th and the 10th of every month. In this meeting, the CSCs will review the crime position that prevails in the different divisions in their jurisdiction the previous month and give necessary directions to the DSCs for expediting the disposal of cases under investigation or trial, taking effective measures to contain the incidence of crime, improving the percentage of detection and expediting the disposal of pending DAR cases. The CSCs may also take stock of other problems being faced by the officers and the men in the divisions and get them resolved at their level itself.

2. Secondly, the CSCs will also hold border meetings with their neighbouring CSCs to discuss matters relating to the incidence of crimes, registration/disposal of cases, transferred from one zone to the other, escorting of trains, joint seal checking etc and other border problems with a view to taking more effective remedial measures. The periodicity for such border meetings will be once in six months.

3. The CSCs will prepare the minutes of the Monthly Crime Review Meetings and send one copy to the DG/RPF for his perusal and necessary action at the Board's level.

4. The minutes of the Border Meetings will be prepared jointly by the participating CSCs and one copy sent to this office by the host CSC.

5. The CSCs should also hold periodical meetings with their GRP counterparts and the GMs of the Railways as contemplated in this office D.O. No. 92/Sec(Spl)/200/28/Pt. dated 12.7.93 (Copy is enclosed for ready reference). Details of such meetings will be reported as soon as the meetings are over.

6. Apart from the above, it is also desired that the Monthly Diaries of the G.Os of Zonal Railways being sent to this office, as required under Board's letter No. 96/Sec(E)/198 Diaries dt. 19.4.96, need not be sent to Railway Board any

longer and scrutiny of and further guidance/instructions, if any, on the same is left to the CSCs concerned, as was being done earlier.

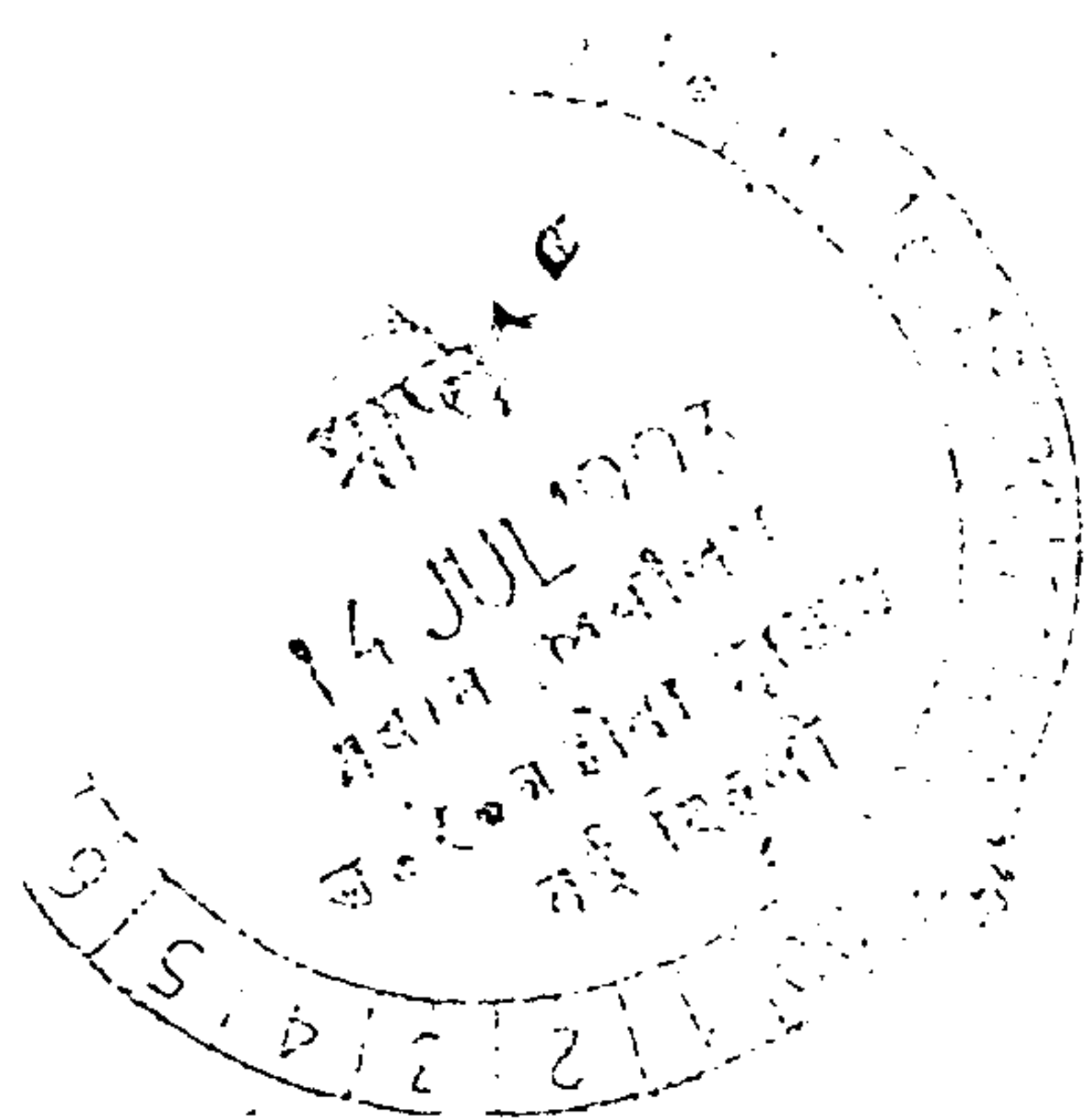
Sub: - Co-ordination Meetings between G.P. and R.F.

The need for holding co-ordination meetings between G.P. and R.F. at various levels has been emphasised in the letter No. 87-Sec(861)/200/10/53/26 dated 6.7.83 and a copy of Ministry of Home Affairs' Secret letter No. 27/83-GPA-VI dated 21.1.1987 addressed to Home Secretaries of all the States and Union Territories was also enclosed. The said letter has institutionalised the meetings between the G.P. and R.F. for better co-ordination and maintenance of law and order on the Railways. In the changed scenario especially in view of prevailing law and order situations in the country, the need for having frequent co-ordination meetings between G.P. and R.F. is sine qua non. This is a forum at which various problems can be discussed frankly across the table and necessary strategies can chalked out to effectively contain crime, disarray criminals and initiate appropriate measures for maintenance of law and order on the Railways premises and to ensure better safety and security to the travelling passengers.

You are therefore, instructed to hold co-ordination meetings with the G.P. authorities with the following frequency:-

(1) ZONAL LEVEL CO-ORDINATION MEETINGS:

- (i) Zonal level co-ordination meetings should be held under the Chairmanship of General Manager in which IGs/DIGs (Railways), SAs, GAs, DAs and DSCs should attend. The meetings should be held once in every six months.



(1) In addition, to the above, CSCs should suo-moto hold co-ordination meetings with IG(R)s/ DIGs (Railways) and SRPs having jurisdiction on the Zonal Railway concerned. Periodicity of this meeting should be at least once in every 3 months, or earlier if the need so arises.

(2) DISTRICT LEVEL CO-ORDINATION MEETINGS:

DSCs/RPF should also hold co-ordination meetings with the concerned SRPs. In this meeting, SRPs/ Dy. SRPs, Inspectors/RPF Incharge of the posts, SIB, CIP and Inspectors/SIs of the GRP should be invited to attend. This meeting should be held every month.

(3) POST LEVEL CO-ORDINATION MEETING:

Inspectors Incharge of RPF Posts should similarly hold co-ordination meetings with the Officers, Incharge of the GRP. This meeting should be held every fortnightly.

In the meetings, to be organised by CSCs and DSCs, the concerned Railway Officers should also be invited so that they can project their view points to make the meetings more objective and also help to chalk out joint strategy, to meet the situation.

proceedings of the meetings at all levels should be recorded and sent to all concerned for compliance and proper follow-up action. The minutes of the zonal level co-ordination meetings held under the Chairmanship of General Managers and the suo-moto meetings held by the CSCs should be forwarded to this office to keep the Board apprised.

Frequent meetings may provoke all concerned to take it casually. Therefore, CSCs to ensure strict supervision and watch on their progress.

An immediate action in the matter is requested.

In this connection, your attention is invited to Board's letter No. 87-Sec(Spl)/200/10/53/26 dated 6.7.87 vide which a copy of Ministry of Home Affairs' Secret letter No. 24013/27/83-GFA-VI dated 21.1.1987 addressed to Home Secretaries of all the States and Union Territories was also enclosed. The said letter had institutionalised the co-ordination meetings between the G and RPF for better control and maintenance of law and order on the Railways.

In the changed scenario, especially, in view of the prevailing law and order situations in the country, the need for having frequent co-ordination meetings at various levels is sine qua non. This is a forum at which mutual problems can be discussed frankly across the table and necessary strategies can chalked out to effectively contain crime, disarray criminals and initiate appropriate measures for maintenance of law and order on the Railways' premises and to ensure better safety and security to the travelling passengers.

You are, therefore, instructed to hold co-ordination meetings with the G authorities with the following frequency:-

(1) ZONAL LEVEL CO-ORDINATION MEETINGS:

- (i) Zonal level co-ordination meetings should be held under the Chairmanship of General Manager in which IGS/DIGs(Railways) SRPs, CSCs, DMs and DSCs should attend. This meeting should be held once in every six months.

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
