STANDING ORDER NO.28.

Sub: Inadmissibility of Appeal in disciplinary cases  
by the staff after disposal of Revision Petition.

It has been observed in a number of DAR cases that the staff have been submitting further appeals after disposal of Revision Petitions probably due to the ignorance of the provision pertaining to appeal and revision contained in Chapter XIII of RPF Rules, 1987.

2. It is reiterated that there is no provision for a further appeal (including mercy petition) after the Revision Petition has been disposed of by the competent authority. In future, such appeals will not be entertained.

3. The provisions regarding appeals and revision as mentioned above should be brought to the notice of all the staff by circulating this Standing Order upto the level of Posts/Outposts within your jurisdiction.
