

STANDING ORDER NO. 45/97

Sub : All India Police Games and All India Police
Duty Meet – Participation of RPF.

The following instructions are issued for fielding RPF teams in the All India police Games and All India Police Duty Meet and also to enhance the sports activities in RPF.

2. The events in the All India Police Games and All India Police Duty Meet are allotted to the Zonal Railway/ RPSF as indicated against each. Rotation of the events will be considered once in three years.



CSCs should conduct Inter-Division RPF/ Inter-Battalion RPSF tournaments in all events mentioned above and select Zonal Railway RPF and RPSF teams during the First Quarter of every year. Such tournaments shall help to locate new talents at the grass root level.

4. The CSCs who are nominated for specific events in the Police Games / Police Duty Meets should organise inter-railway RPF tournament in that particular event and select the RPF team for All India Police Games / All India Police Duty Meet. Nine Zonal Railways RPF and one RPSF teams shall take part in the inter-railway RPF tournaments in each events. These inter-railway RPF tournaments should be completed by the first half of every year. The team so selected should be given At least one month training / coaching at a suitable location in the Zonal Railway which conducted the inter-railway RPF tournament in the particular event. The training of the team should be directly monitored by an officer of the rank of DSC/ASC nominated by the respective CSC. The service of qualified coaches may also be utilised for the coaching of the team. The team so selected should be fielded as 'RPF team' in various local tournaments in games as well as in athletic meets so that the team gets adequate match practice and gets good and abundant exposure. The sports funds held by the Zonal Railways should be utilised to properly equip, train and coach the RPF team. Assistance from DG/RPF from Sports Fund at Security Directorate also may be sought, if needed. After completion of training of teams in the various disciplines, CSCs concerned shall submit a detailed report on the training, standard of the team and the names of the team members to the Security Directorate for information and record.
5. Upon receiving information from Security Directorate about the date and venue of events of "All India Police Games" and "All India Police Duty Meet", the CSC nominated for the event shall reassemble the team and commence further coaching / training to the team till participation of the team in the Games/ Meet. If, for any reason, a team member is not directed to the training camp, the CSC of the Zonal railway/ RPSF to which such a team member belongs to shall specify the reason for not directing the particular individual duly keeping the Security Directorate also informed.
6. The CSCs nominated for the event shall send the nomination forms and the entry fees of the team directly to the Organising Secretary of the Game/ Meet. The entry fee may be deducted from the contribution of the Zonal Railway/ RPSF Sports Fund to DG/RPF's office. The copy of the nomination forms and other details shall also be furnished to Security Directorate for record. The present standardised entry fee for All India Police Games / All India Police Duty Meet is Rs.25/- (Rupees twenty five only) per participant including Manager, Coach, Captain and Reserves.
7. The nominated CSCs shall enter the team as "RPF team". Only one team should be entered in each event except in the case of "Scientific aid to Investigation of Crime" for which a maximum of two teams could be entered. Maximum of two competitors may be nominated for the competition in the Police Photography. The composition of the teams should be communicated to DG/RPF for his information.

8. On completion of each event in the "All India Police Games"/ "All India Police Duty Meet", the CSC to whom the event is allotted shall submit a full report to DG/RPF on the performance of the team, the level achieved in the competition and suggestions for improvement in future.
9. However, it may be noted that the above instructions do not mean that Zonal Railways will only practice the allotted events. They may continue achieving proficiency in other events also so that talents can be identified and utilised in the best possible way.
10. All out efforts should be taken to ensure that RPF team represents the best talents in the Force and that they are given intensive training and motivated to win laurels for the RPF. The CSCs should, therefore, deem this responsibility as a privilege and opportunity given to them to enhance the prestige of the RPF.
11. The AIPDM teams should be accompanied by a Commandant level officer as Manager. He should be associated with intensive training of the teams before they are deputed to AIPDM.
12. For games and athletics, the rank of the Manager should be Asstt. Commandant.
13. The Managers of the teams should submit a detailed report to the CSC in charge of the event within a week after conclusion of the events.
