Dear Shri Batra,

As you may be aware, precedence accorded to dignitaries and officials at State or ceremonial functions is regulated by a Table of Precedence (commonly known as Warrant of Precedence) notified by the President's Secretariat. A copy of the Table (Warrant) of Precedence notified on 26.07.1979, and as amended from time to time (the last such amendment being on 08.09.1994), is enclosed for your kind perusal.

2. In this connection, I may bring to your notice certain basic principles laid down by Shri Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India, with regard to the Table (Warrant) of Precedence. In terms thereof, the then Prime Minister had noted that eminent public persons, scientists, artists and other non-officials, though not included in the Table, may be given appropriately high positions in State/ceremonial/public functions on the basis of their high status in public life. He had, inter alia, observed as under:-

"There are large number of people outside the Warrant of Precedence who in effect are more important than those people who are in the Warrant of Precedence and who, on occasions, may rank higher than those who are included in the Warrant of Precedence. Thus, many non-officials are not included in the Warrant but on any particular function they may be given seats much higher than those included in the list".

3. I am writing this letter to request you that you may please keep the above principle in mind while drawing up the list of invitees and determining the status to be conferred on the guests/invitees, including seating on the dais, at State/ceremonial/public functions that may be organized by your Ministry/Department/State or by your attached/sub-ordinate organizations.

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4. It is possible that such eminent persons may figure in a particular article in the Table (Warrant) of Precedence by virtue of their holding some official position. The above principle will also hold good in regard to such dignitaries and they could accordingly be given higher position in State/ceremonial/public functions on the strength of their eminence or status in public life notwithstanding their position in the Table.

- Note 1. The order in this Table of Procedence is meant for State and Commonial occasions and has no application in the day-to-day business of Covernment.
- Note 2. Persons in the Table of Procedence will take mak in order of the number of the articles. The entries in the same article are arranged alphabetically. These facinated in the same article will take procedence inter as according to date of gainty into that article. However, where the dignituries of different States and Union Territories included in the same article are present at a function outside their States or Union Territories and there is difficulty in ascertaining their dates of entry, they may be assigned procedence later so in the alphabetical order of the name of States and Union Territories concerned after those whose precedence is determined according to date of entry into that article.
- Note 3. Article 7. former Prime Ministers with take procedures over the Cabinets
 Ministers of the Union and the London of Opposition in the Raira Sabba and the
 Lok Babba. The Chief Ministers of States within their respective States with take
 precedence over the Cabinet Ministers of the Union in efficient functions held in
 the respective States.
- tote 4. In Article 8: -
 - (a) Ambassadors Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary and High Commissioners of Commonwealth countries accredited to India will en bloc rank above Governors of States outside their respective States;
 - (b) Governors of States outside their respective States will en bloc rank above Chief Ministers of States outside their respective States.
- Note 5. The Ministry of External Affairs may assign appropriate ranks to foreign dignituries and Indian Ambasandors, High Commissioners and Ministers Plenipotentiary during their visit to India.
- Note 6. ^^ Notwithstanding the procedure hald down in Note 2, the rank later se and precedence of the persons in Article 16 shall be satisfied in the following order: -
 - (1) Deputy Chairman, Ralya Sabha.
 - (2) Deputy Speaker, Lok Sabha.
 - (3) Ministers of State of the Union and any other Minister in the Ministry of Deleuce for defence matters.
 - (4) Deputy Chief Ministers of States.
 - (5) Metabers of Planning Commission.

However, the Deputy Chief Ministers of States outside their respective States will always rank below all other dignituries figuring in this article.

- Note 7. The Chairmen of State Legislative Councils will rank above the Speakers of Legislative Assemblies in cases where they were elected on the same date.
- Note 8. When Members of Parliament are invited en bloc to major State functions, the enclosures reserved for them should be next to the Chief Justice, Speaker of the Lok Sabha, Ambassadors etc.
- Note 9. Speakers of Legislative Assemblies in Union Territories and Chairman of the Delhi Metropolitan Council, Delhi, will take precedence over Ministers and Executive Councillors, included in the same article.

Note 10. In Article 23: -

- (a) Secretaries in the Ministry of External Affairs other than the Foreign Secretary, between themselves, will take precedence in the order of their seniority in Grade-I of the Indian Foreign Service and both of them will take precedence after the Foreign Secretary.
- (b) Members of the Minorities Commission and the Scheduled Castes and Schedule Tribes Commission will always take precedence over the Secretaries of these Commissions:
- (c) In official functions held at Delhi/New Delhi, Army Commanders/Vice Chief of the Army Staff or equivalent in other Services will always rank after Secretaries to the Government of India.

Note 11. In Article 25: -

- (a) Additional Secretaries in the Ministry of External Affairs, among themselves, will take precedence in the order of their seniority in Grade- II of the Indian Foreign Service;
- (b) Additional Solicitor General will take precedence above the Advocate General of States;
- (c) Lieusenant Governors will take precedence over the Chief Ministers and Chief Executive Councillor, Delhi, and the latter will take precedence over Speakers of Legislative Assemblies and Chairman, Metropolitan Council, Delhi;
- (d) Deputy Speakers of Legislative Assemblies of Union Territories and Deputy Chairman of Delhi Metropolitan Conneil will take precedence after Ministers of Union Territories and Executive Councillors, Delhi.
- Note 12. For the purpose of Article 26, the posts equivalent to the posts of Joint Secretaries to the Government of India will be determined by the Ministry of Home Affairs.
